Advantages


- Emergency communication

- Range of expectations:
 - Full ban (not common)
 - Significant limitations (most common)
 - Communication devices secured/sequestered during "instructional time"
 - Three level: Pk-5, 6-8, 9-12
 - Two level: Pk-8, 9-12
 - Almost no limitation/ no clarity (not common)



Which of the following would you most support in Midway ISD schools? 984 responses




Teachers: All (229)
