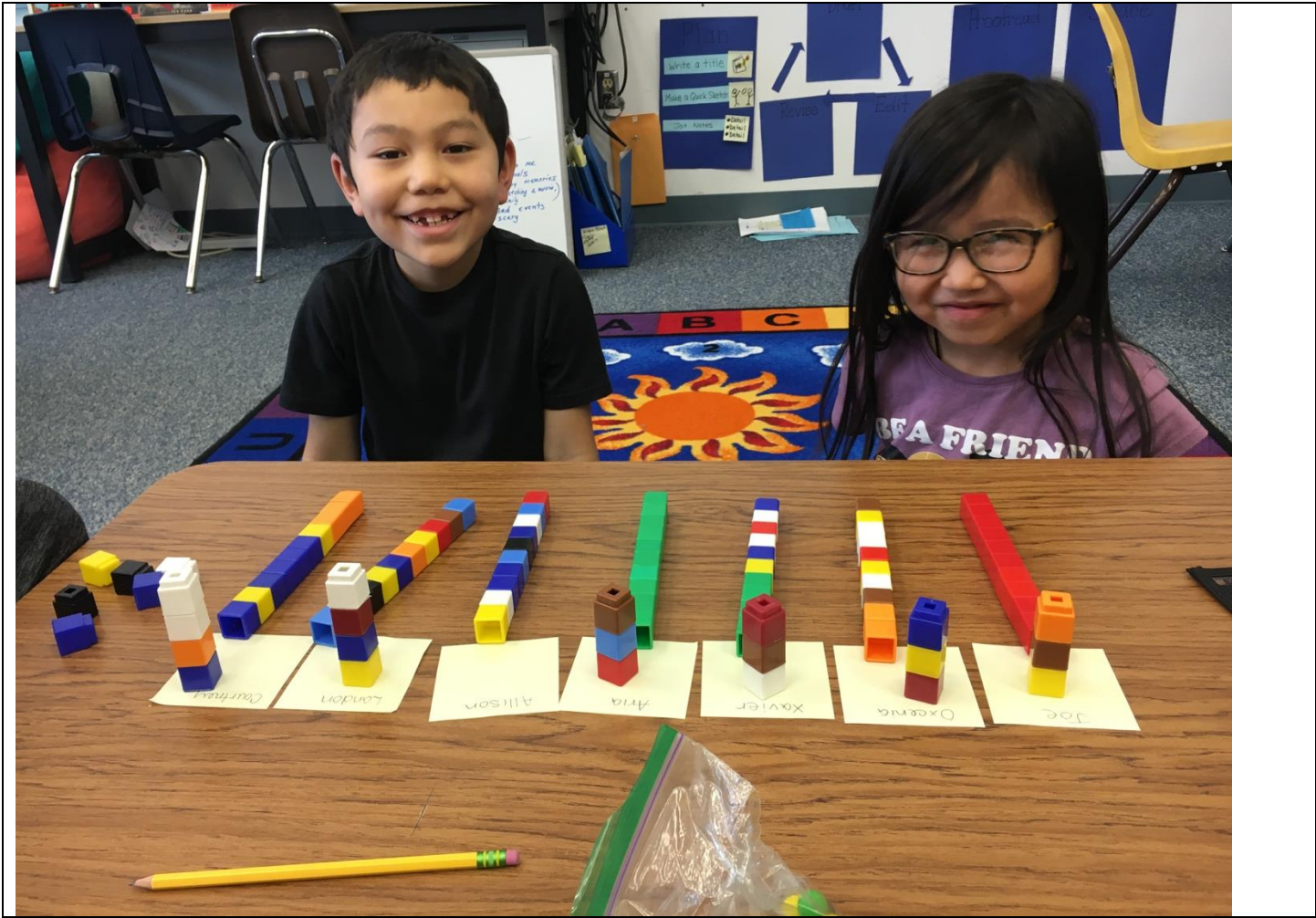
February 7 – Valentine Arts and Crafts

<p>Standards Based System</p> <p>The teachers are feeling the crunch to get all the content taught before the end of the school year, other than that our students are progressing through the LPSD system.
