# Sam Boardman Elementary

# March was a great month at Sam Boardman Elementary

2<sup>nd</sup> Grade has been working all year on researching, writing, and illustrating non-fiction books to publish. Each child had their own topic they researched. Then they wrote a page of the book and illustrated their page as well. Teachers worked with them to make sure these were well-edited. Finally, they submitted each class book to a publisher. Students all received their copy of the book in time for conferences to show their families. They were very proud of their efforts, and we will place a copy of each of the books in the library for check out.

Parent Teacher Conferences were held the last week of March. This was a wonderful time to reconnect with families and show how much progress students have made. Families came to the conferences, chatted about their student's report card and progress, and got to see a variety of examples of their student's work. As they were leaving, families were encouraged to speak with the principal, eat a bag of popcorn or a Popsicle, and fill out a survey about how the school is doing. It was a special time to connect with families and hear how proud they are of their student's progress.

The administrators in Boardman and Officer Shimer have been working this year on creating and implementing a reunification plan if any of our schools were to ever have to evacuate or experience a traumatic event. On Friday, April 1<sup>st</sup>, staff from SBE, WRE, and RJSHS met together and learned about their different roles in reunification. These ranged from scribe to greeters to checkers to runners. After talking through the scenarios, staff practiced on a small scale using the administrators as guinea pigs. There is still more practice to do as well as communication to be had with the community, but this was a good start in preparation for reunification. A huge thanks to Officer Shimer for his dedication and work on this important process.

### Windy River Elementary

Windy River Elementary has welcomed the opportunity to have Officer Shimer in our district. He has been a tremendous source as we move forward in regards to our school safety plan. Recently, we held a "reunification" training at RJSHS. This training consisted of Boardman school employees, mainly classified staff. Our instruction focused on how to reunify our students with their guardians. It was a tremendous success and enjoyed by all. Along with reunification training Officer Shimer has helped our staff to fully utilize our drills each month. We are currently working on creating a more consistent gathering location as we evacuate our building for fire and other circumstances.

In addition to a safety focus our site council has been working all year in the development of our school improvement plan. Through staff and parent survey's we are finalizing a plan to present with our staff. This plan will be ongoing, that will grow and change with each year. As the plan is accepted I will share the details with you.

# Riverside Jr/Sr High School

Spring is in full gear at RJSHS. We are busy with spring sports and preparations for our spring production of Twelve Angry men. We are now in full swing with Smarter Balance testing starting with junior high math.

This month we have 8 students attending a Tech Expo hosted by the ESD that will include hands-on activities with software, apps, coding, hardware, troubleshooting, and operating systems. We also have several more fieldtrips coming up this spring that will give students the opportunity to put to use things learned in their classrooms.

On April 1<sup>st</sup> the Boardman schools did their first training with classified staff on possible reunification scenarios. The training was led by Officer Shimer and gave staff the opportunity to role play through different roles in the reunification process, ask questions, and give feedback. We will be continuing with parent and community awareness and additional staff training in the fall.

- 3) Signed off on our Preventative Maintenance HVAC Contract.

#### Miscellaneous:

- Dirk and Jan attended a meeting in Boardman regarding an opportunity for leasing property as additional parking across from SBE/WRE. We are currently in the process of collecting excavating quotes.
