Students will become familiar with the Alaska State Legislative process and current legislation impacting their education, while learning how to have a voice in the process. Participants also have the opportunity to connect with peers from across the state and participate in conversations with their district's board members around current education legislation.

High school students, **especially sophomores and juniors**, who want to:

- Build and practice leadership
- Enhance their knowledge and communication skills in their school and community,
- Advocate for their school and district (with local school board members), and
- · Learn about other cultures and communities.

To strengthen youth advocacy skills throughout the State, districts are strongly encouraged to send a student(s) who have not yet attended an AASB Youth Leadership Event.

Please mote: In order for students to attend the 2018 Youth Advocacy Institute (YAI), at least one board member or the district superintendent must attend the entire Legislative Fly-In. YAI attendees must also have a designated chaperone (this may be a board member or superintendent) who will be responsible for them outside of YAI sessions).

- YAI is open to students in grades 9-12 and is **limited to 35 students**. Sophomores and Juniors are strongly encouraged to apply.
