For Kindergarten and some First-grade students, this is their first school experience. These students are not in Infinite Campus yet, and they do not have an email address required for their names to sync to the Aimsweb platform. Once the secretaries get students in Infinite Campus, we work with the tech department to get student emails assigned. Due to this process and new students enrolling daily, it typically takes longer to assess all students.

Attendance has also been a factor in getting all students assessed. Teachers are aware of students who have poor attendance and notify assessors as they come to school.

Our goal at KW/Vina is to have Fall Benchmarking data on 100% of our students.
