employee's name and any complaint about any employee's duties or responsibilities should be channeled through the appropriate grievance policy. Additionally, pursuant to board policies BED (LEGAL) and BED (LOCAL), drifting from the stated topic or becoming disruptive shall result in a warning from the board president. A second violation will result in forfeiture of your allotted time and removal from the board meeting. Disruptions include speaking on behalf of or against a person running for political office, promotion of a for-profit organization, or advertisement of products or services to the Board.



# Full-Day PreKindergarten Exemption Waiver

# Summary:

House Bill 3 requires that full-day PreKindergarten be provided for all eligible four-year old students.

# **Exemption Conditions:**

Exemptions may be granted if it determined that:

- The District would be required to construct classroom, repurpose or lease a classroom facility or issue bonds for the construction or repurposing of a classroom facility;
- Implementation of a full-day program would result in fewer eligible children being enrolled in PreKindergarten.





# Full-Day PreKindergarten Exemption Waiver

# Additional Exemption Criteria:

The District may not receive an exemption unless it has solicited and considered at a public meeting the following:

The District did post on its website and in the Laredo Morning Times (January 16, 2020) an ad advising Childcare Providers/Early Learning Centers of District's interest in receiving proposals for partnership and the criteria required. A meeting was held on January 23, 2020 at Proposals for partnerships with public or private entities regarding offering 201 Lindenwood for all interested Childcare providers to attend. The full day preKindergarten for eligible four-year-old students. Deadline to submit proposals was January 30, 2020.



# Exemption Waiver -- Year One: 2019-2020

# **Exemptions from Full-Day PreKindergarten** Effective September 1, 2019

With a three-year exemption, the District must demonstrate good faith attempts to comply with the new requirements and offer full-day PK for all eligible students at the beginning of the 2022-2023 school year.

# g 2019-2020 School Year: Year One of Exemption

- Gather data which shall include the total number of additional classrooms
- Hold a public meeting to solicit proposals for partnerships with eligible childcare providers/early learning centers;
- Consider proposals and make decision to:
- Establish partnership and/or
- Construct, repurpose, lease new space, or issue bonds





# Exemption Waiver -- Year Two: 2020-2021 Year Three: 2021-2022

# 2020-2021 School Year: Year Two of Exemption

- If necessary, hold another public meeting to solicit and consider proposals for partnerships with eligible childcare providers/early learning centers;
- Begin providing full-day to some eligible four-year old children through:
- At least one partnership with an early learning center and/or; At least one constructed, repurposed, leased classroom(s)

# 2021-2022 School Year: Year Three of Exemption

- If necessary, hold another public meeting to solicit and consider proposals for partnerships with eligible childcare providers/early learning centers;
- ♦ Increase full-day opportunities for eligible four-year old children through:
- At least one additional partnership with an early learning center and/or; At least one additional constructed, repurposed, leased classroom(s).

# 2022-2023 School Year:

- District shall begin offering full day PK for all eligible four-year old students
- District may apply for an exemption renewal if unable to offer full-day PK for all (renewed only once).
