Data supporting academic gains in students receiving reading interventions:

•	2 nd grade	19.4% average gain in reading percentile ranking based on the STAR reading assessment
•	3 rd grade	24% average gain in reading percentile ranking based on the STAR reading assessment
•	4 th grade	9.4% average gain in reading percentile ranking based on the STAR reading assessment
•	4 th grade	(3 SWD DRA level increases since 11/21/13)
•	5 th grade	14.5% average gain in reading percentile ranking based on the STAR reading assessment

We compiled information from the DELTA math assessment analyzing CCSS where 1/3 of the students struggled. This information was shared with the previous year's teachers so that they intentionally reflect upon their teaching of these standards.

Kindergarten (First grade Delta data)

- Name numbers 11-19 using tens and ones and some more ones
- Find numbers that add to make 10
- Subtract numbers to 5

First grade (Second grade Delta data)

• Subtract numbers within 10

Second grade (Third grade Delta data)

- Subtract 2-digit numbers
- Add numbers to 20
- Subtract numbers within 20
- Subtract three-digit numbers

Third grade (Fourth grade Delta data)

- Subtract three-digit numbers
- Identify fractions on a number line
- Compare fractions with the name numerator or same denominator
- Multiply numbers from 0 to 10

Divide numbers by 1 to 10

Fourth grade (Fifth grade Delta data)

- Multiply up to a four-digit by a one digit number and two digit numbers
- Divide up to a four digit number by a one digit number
- Compare two fractions with different numerators and different denominators
- Convert between improper fractions and mixed numbers
- Add and subtract mixed numbers with like denominators
- Multiply a whole number by a fraction

Fifth grade (End of year 5th grade STAR Math test)

CCSS data is not available Number of students – 74

- 75th and above 25 students/33.8%
- 50th to 74th 20 students/27%
- 25th-49th-16 students/21.6%
- Below 25th- 13 students/17.6%
