Highest Employee Participation

Awarded with the third highest employee participation is **POINT Alternative Center at 50%**. The principal at POINT is Bill Kimbel, and the United Way campaign coordinator is Nancy Hockless.

Awarded with the second highest employee participation is Clark Elementary at **70%**. The principal is Kem Scheidt and campaign coordinator is Michelle Schramm.

Awarded with the highest employee participation is **Highlands Elementary at 85%**. The principal of Highlands Elementary is Blanca Capetillo, and the campaign coordinator is Renee Stripling.

Highest Monetary Contribution
