
# Why are so many Minnesota school districts asking their communities for additional funding?

Revokes \$206.83 of current levy and replaces this portion with \$1152.83



**Purpose**: To maintain class sizes, protect essential student programs, retain high-quality staff and an opportunity to strengthen elementary arts experiences.

**Purpose**: To fund critical technology and security infrastructure, classroom hardware and software, and technology staff that support all learners and staff.




### Tax Impact Calculator
