## **Adapted Softball**

Head Coach: Diedre Anderson (2nd year)

Adapted Softball had a successful season, not as a result of our record, but because of the impact this team has on its players and coaches. The Coyotes show up to every game and give it their all, while also showing incredible sportsmanship and team player qualities. ## Track and Field

Head Coach: Scott Palmer (28th year as Head Coach)

The spring of 2022 brought some favorable weather and the return of pre-COVID participation numbers to Bison Track and Field. The Girls team boasted 77 student athletes and the boys had 93 student athletes, both numbers far exceed the previous season. The Bison compete in the toughest conference in the state for Track and Field, the Lake Conference. At the Lake Conference Meet, the Bison finished in 7th for both the boys and the girls but were able to score more points than the previous year as well as garner more all conference athletes, with seven All Lake Conference athletes and 6 honorable mention All Lake Conference athletes. The fierce competition week in and week out in the Lake Conference does pay dividends; at the end of the year the Bison Tracksters are battle tested seeing the state's best on a weekly basis. The Bison sent 17 athletes to the state meet hosted at STMA and brought home 10 All State awards. The Bison were represented in the following events; Girls 4x200 (5th), 4x400 (4th), 200 and the 400 (4th). Boys 4x800 (1st), 4x400, 800 (1st), 3200, 1600 and the Discus. Both the Boys and Girls teams posted 8 Bison Top Ten performances each and the girls were able to break school records in the 100 Hurdles, 400 meter dash, 4x200 meter relay and the 4x400 meter relay.

## **Boys Golf:**

Head Coach: Paul Olson (6th year)

The 2022 golf season was notable for multiple reasons. One of the most significant being the sale of Wild Marsh by the City of Buffalo to a private ownership group. Wild Marsh has been the home for Bison golf almost since it opened.

The transition of management took place only a month prior to the scheduled season opening and the start of practices. The relationship and goals were new both for BHS and the owners and initially presented some challenges. After multiple correspondences and meetings, BHS staff, coaches and the owners were able to negotiate a schedule and agree upon expectations that allowed structured access to the course and some flexibility in scheduling home events.

On league or event days, practice shifted to the Golfmasters Driving Range. League play increased incrementally until mid-May when tee times for practices were most limited. The staff at Wild Marsh always made an attempt to be accommodating while also being mindful of their commitments to leagues. Going forward, pre-season conversations with the owners should take place annually, prior to opening, to negotiate and agree upon terms and conditions for BHS use.

23 students registered for golf. All took part in basic preseason indoor practices. It was made clear that due to time and space limitations at Wild Marsh and a full schedule of V and JV events commencing almost immediately, tryouts would need to be held. Due to the weather and Wild Marsh being closed, the tryouts were eventually held over two days at Buffalo Heights Golf Course. A team consisting of 14 players was selected based upon scores. It consisted of 6 Varsity/6 JV and 2 developmental players.

For 2022, there were 5 Varsity Intra-Lake Conference competitions. Three of them were "double-duals" with 3 teams competing together at the home course of one of the teams. Coaches were expected to schedule the events by working with the course and the other two teams. The other two events were a conference mid-year and final. BHS hosted the Mid-Year event at Wild Marsh. The balance of the season included invitationals or "competitions" with nearby schools. The final Varsity schedule consisted of 15 competitions.

The Lake Conference does not schedule events for Junior Varsity golf teams. It was thereby incumbent upon the coaches to develop a JV schedule. BHS JV coach Mark Pokorney was able to schedule 12 competitions that included dual meets and invitationals. With that number of meets, the coaches were also able to provide multiple opportunities for all 14 players.

Team highlights for the season included a very impressive 3rd place finish in the final Lake Conference standings highlighted by a 2nd place finish in the Conference finals at Baker National. Three Conference teams were rated among the top teams in the State, (Edina captured the State title), making for an elite level of competition. Conference standings are determined by points awarded during the season and the finals. Two Bison players, Arthur Ylitalo and Jayce Hansen, earned All-Conference awards while Harvey Ylitalo earned Honorable Mention.

Other season highlights included 1st place finishes in 3 multi-team Varsity invitationals. The BHS Varsity team's lowest finish was 5th. The team established what is believed to be a school record low team score of 291, (a team's 4 lowest scores of it's 6 count). Junior Arthur Ylitalo shot a competitive round of 66 which is also believed to be a school record. The JV had a very respectable season team low score of 349 and placed in the top 10 at multiple large events.

## <u>Girls Golf</u>

Head Coach: Tim Murray (2nd year as Head Coach)

After a year in the Lake Conference, the Buffalo Bison Golf team came into the season with a desire to use past experiences to have another successful season. We had a core group of golfers on Varsity that was joined by JV golfers that were ready to compete and play at the varsity level. Once again, we found success through several different metrics, despite the win/loss record not always showing success.

The team consisted of 19 golfers, with 8 new to the team. Unlike last year, we had a more consistent varsity core. This year, we had 7 golfers compete at the varsity level: Aspen Adams, Kendra Carey, Anna Kugler, Natalie Mix, Mackenzie Mjelde, Hayley Rohlin, and Raegan Wurm. All of these golfers earned a varsity letter. We had four seniors this year: two that had previous BHS golf experience in Grace Murphy and Claudia Staut; and two that joined to have a positive end to their High School career in a life-long sport: Elisabeth Krinke and Payton Tweten.

Every year, our team discusses what "being successful" means; both to them as an individual, and as a team. Almost immediately, the team identifies that success is not defined by the wins and losses, first-place finishes, or "winning it all." Each golfer identified various golf skills as well as team measures in which they could define success. From, "learning to hit a shot out of the sand," to "understanding how a penalty is counted," to "enjoying time outside with friends," to "making it to the second day of Sections." We had a wide-range of successful goals and many of them were met.

We also found success competitively when we finished second in a conference match at Oak Ridge Country Club, a successful finish at Rogers' Invitational, and a day-two showing at sections at Rich Spring Golf Club. Throughout the year, the team remained positive despite not always finishing as good as they felt they could - but when it mattered, they played awesome at sections. It had been a few years since the team made it to day two of sections and it was a great way to cap off another successful season.

I want to end this year's recap the same way that I ended last year's recap: We will continue to work hard and prepare to compete in our conference and section against the best golfers across the state and we will continue to look for successes on and off the course. It was an amazing season with amazing girls that continue to amaze both Coach Murray and Coach Conroy with their positivity, perseverance, patience and purpose. We can't wait for what 2023 has in store for us all!

### **Baseball**

Head Coach: Mike Beilke (19 years)

The Bison finished the year with a record of 3-17. We finished the year with a Lake Conference record of 2-10. One of the highlights of the season was beating the number 2 and 5 ranked teams in the state. Evan Soeffker and Tristan Moore were selected to the All-Conference team and Logan LaPlante and Carson Schwartz received Honorable Mention All-Conference Awards. Paul Brown was voted Most Improved. Evan Soeffker was voted Most Dedicated, Captains Award, MVP, Pitching Award and Hitting Award. Tyson Moore was selected as Rookie of the Year. Dawson West was selected for the Hustler and Ultimate Teammate Awards. Tristan Moore received the Captains Award. Evan Soeffker was selected to the Metro West All Star Team. Evan Soeffker, Paul Brown, Max Hartke, Doug Bartlett and Dawson West will all be lost to graduation. Thank you to the seniors for their outstanding attitudes and leadership. We are very excited about the players we have returning for next season. We have a wealth of young talent returning. We have several pitchers with varsity experience returning for next season. I really enjoyed coaching this group of young men. Go Bison!!!

## **Boys Tennis:**

Head Coach: Ben Watkins (11th Year)

The 2022 Buffalo Boys Tennis team was very possibly the most successful and talented team that has come through our school in the past 13+ years. The group of graduating seniors has accounted for more career victories than any other graduating class I have had. They ended the year with a team record of 15-9, however 8 of the 9 losses were at the hands of teams ranked inside the top 10 in Wisconsin or Minnesota, and 3 of those losses were 3-4 losses that were incredibly close matches!

Some season highlights included early season wins against Washburn, St. Paul Harding and Elk River, which was the first time Buffalo has beaten perennial powerhouse Elk River in over 30 years! The success did not stop there. The team also had convincing wins over very good Brainerd, St. Cloud Tech, Alexandria and Rogers teams, but the most telling stretch of the season came toward the end of the year when Buffalo played against STMA, Monticello and Delano within a two-day span. Buffalo beat each team 7-0 without losing a single set against any of our rival schools. It was a really fun two days!

Sam Shaffer (10th grade) repeated this year with the most singles wins (14), while junior Andrew Lotthammer won 18 doubles matches, which paced the team. Andrew had the highest winning percentage on the team, but was followed closely by Sam, Patrick Lubben and Andy Shaffer, who all had very successful years.

Award winners for this year's team consisted of Turner Marr and Andy Shaffer, sharing the team MVP, freshman Daniel Jungwirth was voted as the most improved player, and senior captain, Patrick Lubben, was voted as the Bison/Team Spirit Award recipient. Turner Marr, Andy Shaffer and Sam Shaffer each earned 1st team all-conference honors, especially prestigious in the Lake Conference, while Patrick Lubben and Gavin Wyatt earned honorable mention.

Once again, the team earned the All-State Gold award, with a team GPA higher than 3.75, which ended with an average team GPA (top 10 high school GPAs of our section roster) of 3.95 - the highest I have ever had, which really speaks to how hard these guys work in the classroom and the incredibly high standard they hold themselves to!

It was an incredible year with a group of student-athletes that refused to give up and continued to improve throughout the season with hard work and great attitudes. I am incredibly proud to coach this group of young men - they inspire me with how well they treat their opponents and each other.

#### **Boys Lacrosse**

Season Recap:

We had an undefeated regular season record of (13-0) sweeping the Lake Conference and winning the Conference Championship. We ended with a loss to #2 ranked (at the time) in the state Chanhassan finishing the year (14-1).

Layne Kology led the state in goals with (73) and Ethan Nuss led the state in assists with (52). Griffin Valli was 4th in state in Forced Turnovers (56) and Connor. Youngquist was 7th in state with (46) Forced Turnovers. Lane was All American, Griffin was 2nd Team All State. Griffin, Ethan, Layne and Hunter were All Section (2) as well. Owen (5.45), Layne (5.8) and Ethan (5.2) all had north of 5 Pts/game. I was Section 2 Coach of the Year.

# Summer Marching Band

Unbelievable. That's all I can say about this year's band. The math says it all. We had our smallest band ever in 2021 (86 including 29 "super seniors") and bounced back with

123 members in 2022. This means this large band was almost half rookies. We had a tremendous amount to learn and very little experience to build on. Yet, our season was fantastic by any standard. Attendance was terrific. The leadership team met their sections "where they were at" and moved them forward one step at a time...literally.

As always, we had one of the largest bands in the state...only two bands were larger. And, with less rehearsal time than every other group, we continue to be highly ranked. Although we don't have a state championship in parade marching, I am comfortable saying that we ended the season ranked 4th in the state of MN once again. I am satisfied with that finish. Our colorguard, once again, matched up to the performance level of the winds, the drumline, and the overall marching skill of the rest of the band. This allowed us to jump into the top 5 last year, and stay there this year.
