Migrant Summer School

SDE Migrant Program Coordinator, Mary Lou Wells, has again recommended that the Homedale and Marsing School Districts combine dollars to run a Migrant Summer School in Homedale for students of both districts. To ensure enough money has been allotted to make such a combined effort successful, Homedale has been provided an additional \$25,000 in Title I-C Migrant funds. We appreciate the generosity of the SDE and look forward to again joining with the Marsing School District to provide an enhanced summer school experience for our Migrant students.

Reallocated Funds Application

This year the Homedale School District is requesting reallocated Title I-A funds to support Homedale's portion of a joint Homedale-Marsing School District summer school session for our Title I-A at-risk K-5 students. This would be in addition to the Migrant summer school session. This Marsing partnership will allow Homedale Title I-A students summer learning opportunities we have not been able to provide in recent years because of budget cuts.

Marsing School District and the Marsing Academies 21st CCLC Summer program have the structure and operations in place to include 50 of Homedale's at-risk students in their three week long Jump Start summer school. If approved for these reallocated funds, Homedale School District will partner with them to deliver programming to 50 at-risk students from the Homedale School District from July to the first part of August on their campus. We should know within the next few weeks about the status of the application.
