

## Board Report November 27, 2016

### 1. What's new at CIHS?

i. **From PBIS:** The grade levels with the least number of Behavior Reports (B.R.) for this past month were: 11<sup>th</sup> grade (8 B.R.)—(2<sup>nd</sup> month in a row), 9<sup>th</sup> grade (10 B.R.)—(2<sup>nd</sup> month won!) and the 7<sup>th</sup> grade (26 B.R.)—(2<sup>nd</sup> month too)\*. The students in grades 9 and 11 will receive a special treat this month. \*The 7<sup>th</sup> grade will not because they didn't meet the 10 or under requirement. All three grades will have the Ranger Way “**You're A Class Act**” banner being hung in their locker bay. The “treat or reward” gets bigger the more times a class wins the monthly contest each semester. In Grades 7-12, there were 95 B.R. for the month. This is more than the 74 Behavior Reports last school year for the month of **October**. Year-to-date totals are: 145 for 2017-18 and 111 for 2016-17. **Our goal is to have 80% (or higher) of the students in grades 7-12 with zero or one Behavior Report.** At the end of the month, we had 93.5% of the students in that category compared to 95% last year.

ii. During “Arena Style” conferences on **November 2nd**, Nickie Doyle, 7-12 Counselor, arranged to have a variety of booths set up in the Commons to provide information on many different topic areas. We hoped parents would not only join us for conferences with their student's teachers, but that they would also take time to explore and to ask questions of the representatives at booths in which they had an interest.
