Principal's Corner



We just concluded a very busy first semester with a variety of activities in and outside our classrooms. I am optimistic with the student grade data from the first semester. This being said, we know there is more work to do with students that struggle in a traditional setting. With this information, staff continues to work through professional learning communities on Fridays to identify things we can do to improve. Our Leadership class has done a wonderful job facilitating activities, including spirit weeks and assemblies to keep school spirit and the unity on campus at a current all-time high level. I want to commend our student leaders and their teachers- both Ms. Townes and Ms. Wright for their tireless effort to make a difference in our school. We are just finishing up a busy and successful winter athletic season with student and team successes in basketball, wrestling, swimming and bowling. If you have not had an opportunity to take the survey, it is still on our website through the end of February for those that would like to share their thoughts.

The second semester promises to be just as busy as we compete in many spring music/ athletic contests. We also will participate in the Smarter Balance Assessment in English and Math for all 11th grade students. This combined with an array of school community events and a distinguished graduation ceremony for our senior class are but a few of the activities here second semester. It is my hope that parent/ community participation is high as our students love the support we garner as they embark on the next series of school wide activities.

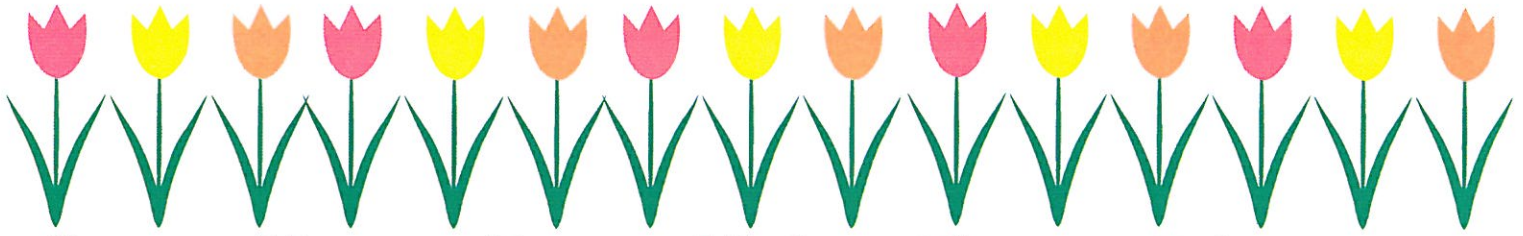

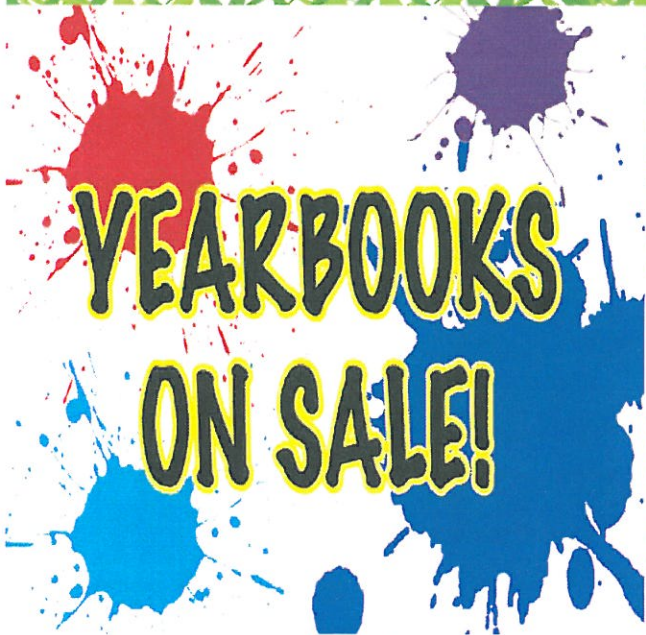
