# Senate Status

---

- Passed in Senate easily
- Only about one hour of hearings
- Under review by House Law and Justice Committee
- Need full House and Governor approval

# Senate: Statute of Limitations

---

- SB 871 (O'Brien)
  - Eliminate SOL on second-degree CSC of a minor.
  - Extend third-degree CSC of a minor until victim turns 48 or at any time based on new DNA.
- SB 872 (Knezek)
  - 10-year civil SOL for conduct that constitutes CSC
  - Minor victim has until age 48 based on CSC after December 31, 1996.

# Senate: Sexual Assault Reporting

---

- SB 873 (O'Brien)
  - Adds adults involved in interscholastic sports – including coaches, asst coaches, athletic trainers and volunteers – as mandatory reporters.
- SB 874 (Jones)
  - Increases the penalty for not reporting child abuse.
- SB 880 (Jones)
  - Updates sentencing guidelines with increased penalty for failure to report.

# House Status

---

- Much more deliberative than Senate
- Lengthy committee hearings
- Ultimate timeline unclear
- Need full House, Senate, and Governor approval

# House: Sexual Assault Reporting

---

- HB 5537 (Kesto)
  - Criminalizes interference with report.
- HB 5539 (LaSata)
  - Expands OK2Say program to cover sexual misconduct.
- HB 5659 (Griffin)
  - Adds college employees, coaches, asst coaches, trainers, volunteers as mandatory reporters.

# House: Sexual Assault Reporting

---

- HB 5796 (Pagan)
  - Training for mandatory reporters.
- HB 5797 (Pagan)
  - Anonymity for sexual assault plaintiffs.
- HB 5824 (Huges)
  - Licensed health professional must report others.



# House: Medical Records

---

- HB 5783 (Whiteford)
  - Healthcare providers, including athletic trainers and physical therapists, must retain records referencing penetration for 15 years.
- HB 5784 (Hauck)
  - Sentencing guidelines for failing to document certain medical services.
- HB 5793 (Theis)
  - Chaperone and consent requirements.

# House: Ombudsman

---

- HB 5795 (Singh)

- Creates sexual assault ombudsman.
- Will advocate for higher ed students who may be victims of sex assault.
- Will encourage colleges and universities to improve sexual assault services.
