

The Home Access Center has a lot of helpful information for families, but is most often used to check on your child's progress in school. The Home Access Center is linked on the District 33 website, as well as the Leman website.

When you log into the Home Access Center, you will see a row of buttons at the top of the page.

To see their daily progress, click on the "Classes." button. You can see how your student is doing on their daily classwork. The assignments under the Classes tab are $updated \ frequently. \ We \ recommend \ reviewing \ your \ child's \ grades \ once \ a \ week \ to see \ their \ progress.$

October - National Bullying Prevention Month

How to Prevent Bullying

Parents, school staff, and other caring adults have a role to play in preventing bullying. They can:

- Help kids understand bullying.
 - Talk about what bullying is and how to stand up to it safely. Tell kids bullying is unacceptable. Make sure kids know how to get help and tell an adult right away.
- Keep the lines of communication open.
 - Check in with kids often. Listen to them. Know their friends, ask about school, and understand their concerns.
- Encourage kids to do what they love.
 - Special activities, interests, and hobbies can boost confidence, help kids make friends, and protect them from bullying behavior.
- Model how to treat others with kindness and respect.

Updates From ELA and Advanced Spanish Classes at LMS!

6th Grade ELA Update:

For 6th grade Language Arts, students are working to strengthen their reading and writing skills.

Last week, students completed MAP testing and set winter MAP goals. We are impressed with the growth that we have seen thus far, and cannot wait to see student scores continue to grow throughout the year. Please take a moment to ask your child about their score and winter MAP goals.

This month in 6th grade ELA, we are beginning to read our core novel. The Giver. Students will focus on identifying the main character, genre, objective summary (Somebody, Wanted, But, So, Then), and intended audience. Students will practice supporting their claims with evidence from the text.

At home, students are expected to read for 30 minutes each night, and a guardian needs to sign the reading log weekly. All assignments that students do not complete during independent work time need to be completed at home. We are thrilled to watch students strengthen their ELA skills while achieving their reading goals, and to help prepare them for their educational journey at



7th Grade ELA Update:

In 7th grade ELA, we have been working on building our students' reading and writing stamina through independent reading, homework, read alouds, journaling, and summarizing. Students have chosen their independent reading books and should be bringing them home every night.

We have also started reading the novel Alex Rider, and are in the first few chapters. Accelerated has started reading the novel Red Wall. During read alouds, we model skills that we want students to be able to do on their own when they read. The first few skills we have been working on are summarizing, context clues, and analysis of word choice.

Students have also finished their MAP reading test, and are working on completing their IXL Reading diagnostic. We will use this data to create conferencing groups and target specific skills students need to work on to make progress..

We are so excited to keep learning about your child and helping them grow as readers and writers!

8th Grade ELA Update:

In 8th grade English Language Arts, we are committed to ensuring all students are prepared for high school, career, and college readiness with the essential skills of reading, writing, speaking, and listening. In 8th grade, students are focused on the standards of determining a theme of a text, using evidence to justify their claims and reasoning, and being able to write down their arguments in an organized fashion while citing the strongest textual evidence pieces

Additionally, students will collaborate, share, ideas, and critically think about essential questions at the start of each lesson and evaluate character choices creating thoughts and judgments of the character's development.

Throughout the trimester, students will be exposed to print texts such as *The Outsiders* and *Maus 2* and use multimodal texts to compare and contrast text details with film production and whether the director or actors stay faithful to a text or depart from the original text.

We are excited to be working with your child this school year and prepare them for any challenges at the high school level!

Advanced Spanish Update:

Hello families! The Advanced Spanish team is so happy to be back and working with your students!

For a bit of insight as to what is happening in the classroom. Students are taking part in various activities such as reviewing spanish grammar concepts, analyzing texts such as articles and short stories, as well as taking part in a lot of collaboration work with classmates. We are focusing on goal setting with the students in relation to their descriptive writing in the target language with a lot of focus on elaboration. Due to this, we will be working on tracking growth in relation to explaining, describing, the use of transition words and adjectives.


We are seeing that many students are finding success by being prepared for class with their notebooks and folders as well as utilizing organizers in class. We have also noticed that the great majority of students are making it to class on time and not getting tardies. We are very pleased with the excellent start of the year!

All of the nominees will be recognized and grade level winners will be selected from these nominees each month.


The administration team is excited to highlight some of the students who are meeting and exceeding our expectations each month and help to make Leman a great place to learn!
