### End of 2nd Quarter Activities

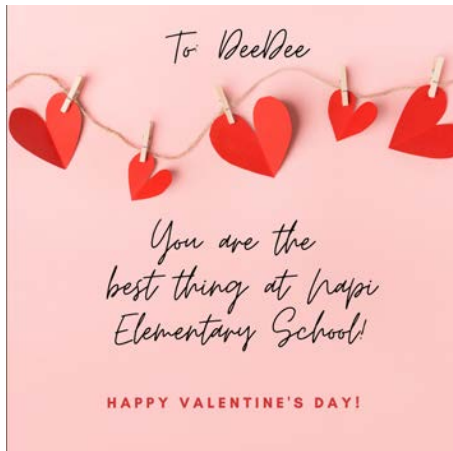

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### Instructional Coaches: Submitted by Mrs. Wagner

Good afternoon! We have had a very busy and fulfilling month! Firstly, we thank you for attending the monthly noon board meeting hosted by our wonderful administrators and building students and staff! Our students look forward to this yearly event so we can showcase all the great things we do at Napi Elementary! Secondly, our staff and students are doing such an excellent job this year! We have been working diligently in making sure everyone has what they need in order to successfully teach our required curriculums. The instructional coaching have been busy working with staff to ensure both ELA and math instruction is occurring without hiccups. Mrs. Bragg continues to work with the interventionist and the specials who are teaching intervention classes to identified students. Mrs. Wagner continues to provide professional development to all classroom teachers in mathematical content currently being covered in our math curriculum. Both instructional coaches also continue to provide tutoring to students identified as T1 and T2 in math on Friday afternoons. Together with the School Leadership Team, we planned and hosted the February "I Love to Read" family literacy night. As new students enroll in our school, the coaches ensure they are properly assessed and given the appropriate materials needed to be successful students. The coaches also hosted a Secret Valentine event that helps with staff morale. In addition to that, we also had the pleasure of participating in the district's wellness activities. Both coaches have a combined total of 7 active coaching cycles and both coaches continue to provide support while using walkthrough data to help guide instruction. Data was shared and discussed at each grade level team meeting and it was decided that we will use a focused agenda on Mondays to ensure we are capturing the daily data needed to determine for focused instruction with our T3 and low T2 students. Although February is a short and sweet month, we are looking forward to finishing the 3rd quarter strong and preparing for the end of year benchmark testing and state testing. The coaches will continue to provide the needed and necessary support to all staff here at Napi Elementary!

### Spookanapi--Submitted by Mrs. Wells

During the month of February, the Spookanapi program has been focusing on the prevention of vaping and decreasing the number of offenses in the district. I am happy to report that the number of Vaping offenses has decreased significantly from the first quarter to third quarter. Before Christmas break the number of vaping offenses at Napi was 12. After Christmas break the Spookanapi specials focused on the Harmful Effects of Vaping on the Developing Body and cleared up any misconceptions about vaping. In the second quarter there were 2 offenses and in the third quarter there was 1 offense.

Due to the number of vaping offenses the Napi school has started implementing the Insight classes at the end of second quarter. Students must complete 4 hours of Insight class for the first vaping offense. Currently no second offenses at Napi but if there was a second offense Crystal Creek would complete an assessment with students to create a plan for students by providing educational resources and services from both Crystal Creek and Spokinaapi staff. Combined with the vaping lessons during specials the Vaping Prevention has been very impactful for students.

Some of the other activities that Spookinaapi has been implementing is having lunch groups for students who may be having a difficult day, conflicts, and or needing a space to manage their emotions. Providing conflict resolutions skills for students who are having difficulty communicating or expressing themselves. Spookinaapi is also helping facilitate small Dessa groups for students who may need some extra focus on increasing their Dessa scores.

### **Counselor Center--Mr. Andreas**

Greetings from the Counseling Center. It was a pleasure to present to the school board during February and I hope that I highlighted the need for a second counselor at Napi Elementary for next year.

During February, all students in grades 4 and 5 received social emotional instruction using the Second Step Curriculum on the topic of managing strong emotions. The Second Step Social Emotional Curriculum is used throughout the school year as part of the specials rotation and students will learn problem solving skills and emotional management skills later on this school year. In addition to the Second Step Instruction, identified Tier 3 students receive both daily Check and Connect services and Dessa Small Group Instruction to build social emotional skills if they are struggling. Check and Connect, Dessa Small Groups and Second Step were all highlighted at the board meeting in February.

The Napi Counseling Center has also been busy providing supportive services to students who need them to be academically successful. These services include; coats, hats and gloves as needed, access to showers and hygiene products, weekend food program, referrals to IHS Behavioral Health, special services screening/assessment services, home visits and family support, 504 medical plans and accommodations, emergency transportation, conflict mediation and crisis counseling as needed. It is my vision to assist guardians and students in eliminating the barriers to academic success so that students can become successful.
