# **Discussion of Elementary Attendance Boundaries**

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### **Discussion of Elementary Attendance Boundaries**

#### Purpose of Report:

To provide the Board of Trustees an overview of elementary attendance boundaries we are closely monitoring to ensure adequate and equitable access to instruction while supporting a safe and orderly environment for all.

#### Objectives:

- Review current attendance boundaries for Pecan Creek Elementary and Stephens Elementary schools
  - Discuss four developments expected to come online as early as late fall and into the coming year(s)
  - o Consider implications for enrollment
  - o Share possible adjustments, which will not impact current students
- Review the current attendance boundary for Union Park
  - o Discuss fast growth in the area
  - Consider implications for enrollment
  - Share possible considerations in anticipation of elementary school #25

#### **Operational Impact:**

Operational impact would be minimal for any changes made to the Pecan Creek/Stephens boundaries. No students would be impacted by this change if adjustments are made this fall. Construction/leasing for these developments has not yet been initiated but is expected this fall.

Additional discussions and considerations will be forthcoming as enrollment projections are finalized for this fast growth area.

#### Results:

### **Advantages:**

Modifications to the Pecan Creek Elementary School attendance boundary would address the significant impact to enrollment capacity anticipated should these developments remain within the current attendance boundary of Pecan Creek Elementary. Adjustments to the attendance boundaries now, may eliminate the need for the District to adjust boundaries once homes/developments are built and occupied. These adjustments also allow for balancing the enrollment between Pecan Creek Elementary and Stephens Elementary.

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Considering adjustments to the Union Park attendance zone now, in consideration of elementary school #25, will allow early communication to be shared with new families moving into the area. Closely monitoring this area allows us to ensure adequate and equitable access to instruction while supporting a safe and orderly environment for all.

#### **Disadvantages:**

Modifications to the attendance boundary of Pecan Creek Elementary School requires continuous monitoring due to current capacity. Without an adjust this fall, the campus is expected to exceed 720 students in 2021 – 2022 based on Templeton's projections.

#### **Other Options:**

The District could maintain current attendance boundaries for the Pecan Creek and Stephens campuses and allow for transfers until the impacted campuses reach capacity. Maintaining current boundaries would require the District to address attendance boundaries in the near future to address enrollment capacity for Pecan Creek Elementary. The disadvantage to this option will be the impact to students and families adjusting to possible rezoning after attendance at a particular campus has begun.
