The data indicated that the Weighted Achievement Score is lower than Value-Added Growth Score. Therefore, areas of concern Weighted Achievement Score and particular attention needs to continue to be given to our sub groups, again, particularly in Literacy and Science. Data shows that projected - NWEA showed growth but not expected growth in all areas students showed growth in the data that we have.

Factors - What factors are likely to have contributed to these results? Consider both external and internal factors to the school.

COVID impacted expected growth. Currently, we have ten dedicated periods for mathematics and ELA courses. These ten dedicated periods are likely to raise scores in growth and achievement. Additionally, usage of technology platforms will be continued (e.g., NWEA, Edulastic, ALEKS, USA Test Prep, Newsela, Empowering Writers, NoRedInk, ACT Aspire Interim Assessments) to enhance the student learning experience.

The downward pressure on scores can somewhat be attributed to staffing changes. There were new teachers teaching both Literacy and Science.

This data clearly shows that in terms of projected readiness (as determined by ACT) for state standardized testing, the students are scoring at levels equal to or higher than the summative for 2020-21. However, though the scores are above the state and region, they are not at our intended levels, nor are they at the levels we envision for our students.

However, there was a drop in Interim 3 in some areas. The team has discussed the correlation of lesson planning and technological resources (ALEKS, for example) as well as using intervention hours strategically.

Factors - What factors are likely to have contributed to these results? Consider both external and internal factors to the school.

COVID impacted expected growth Students who enrolled in LISA Academy North Middle from the LISA district elementary schools tended to show greater achievement through middle school grades, while students who were new to the LISA Academy system tended to lag in achievement, but show better than average growth. This growth is largely a function of the greater time and intensity of the curriculum and greater amounts of time spent with teachers that the LISA Academy curriculum affords. The implementation of some of the technology platforms ultimately provided students with greater access to personal instruction and individual practice.

Section II-A Action Plan - Objectives

Objective 1: Students at LISA Academy North Middle will score above the regional and state averages in English.

Action Plan: LISA Academy North will employ a data-driven instructional model that utilizes the Unit tests, NWEA tests, and summative state tests to guide instruction. Interventionists will supplement small group and individual teaching. Through cross-curricular teams, Science of Reading principles will be implemented.

Objective 2: Students at LISA Academy North Middle will score above the regional and state averages in math.

Action Plan: LISA Academy North will employ a data-driven instructional model that utilizes the NWEA MAP Growth test, unit tests in Math, and summative state test to guide instruction. ALEKS will be used to determine student needs and provide student practice. Interventionists will supplement small group and individual teaching

Objective 3: Students at LISA Academy North Middle will score above the regional and state averages in reading.

Action Plan: LISA Academy North will employ a data-driven instructional model that utilizes the NWEA MAP growth test, unit test in Reading and state summative test to guide instruction. We will establish a new reading program to increase reading comprehension and accountability. Science of Reading principles will guide a cross-curricular approach to comprehension and vocabulary acquisition. Interventionists will supplement small group and individual teaching.

Objective 4: Students at LISA Academy North Middle will score above the regional and state averages in science.

Action Plan: LISA Academy North will employ a data-driven instructional model that utilizes the NWEA MAP growth test in Science and state summative test to guide instruction. Programs like Project Lead The Way, Science Fair, STEM Festival, Coding classes, and robotics will be made available to even more students to heighten awareness of and interest in science. There will be increased integration of science into general health education.

Objective 5: Students at LISA Academy North Middle will score above the regional and state averages in writing.

Action Plan: Students at LISA Academy North Middle will continue to develop writing skills to boost ELA composite score above regional and state averages.

Objective 6: LISA Academy will make measurable progress in improving the School Quality and Student Success element of the ESSA standards.

Action Plan: LISA Academy North will reduce chronic absenteeism by encouraging good attendance and student participation in extracurricular activities. The school registrar and Dean of Students will use eSchool reports and functions for monitoring student attendance. Parents will be contacted via administrative communication when students reach 3, 6, and 9 absences in a semester. Perfect attendance students will be entered to participate in a \$10 gift card drawing during quarterly award ceremonies. Half days on Wednesdays will allow families to plan appointments on those days instead of missing instructional time.

- Proficiency (Science): Requirement to use Science of Reading principles in each science classroom. There will be a cross-curricular approach to increase student proficiency in scientific reading.

Objective 7: LISA Academy will increase parent involvement in the life of the school.

Action Plan: LISA Academy will use the VOLY system for involving parents in volunteer opportunities at the school. We will begin an Athletic Booster Club to increase parent involvement in athletic programs. Special events like Open House, Family Paint Night, Staff/Alumni/Student games, and academic information nights will be held for families. Parents are provided help with filling out FAFSA, college guidance (including evening programs for parents who cannot come throughout the day), and parent academic nights for discussion of schedules, graduation plans, opportunities for students, and fostering conversations about the betterment of the school from their perspective. LISA Academy has an ongoing home visitation program, in which teachers and administrators participate. In the coming year we intend this program to continue to grow. LISA Academy organized and presented a parent academy, a weekend event that covered topics including but not limited to Personal Finance, Cyber Security, Eating health, and obesity.
