# August 2024 - Activities Director Board Report

### Tomahawk High School:

And so it begins...... The month of August brings the unofficial start to the 2024 - 2025 school year with High School Sports beginning this month. Football begins practice on Tuesday August 6th under the direction of second year Head Coach Dewey Reilly. The Hatchets will be moving back into the Great Northern Conference for football during the 2024 Fall Season. There is a lot of excitement with our program being able to compete with our traditional rivals and having shorter travel distances for the student body to attend road games this fall. Next sport to begin, will be Girls' Swimming on Tuesday August 13. This will be the first year for our new staff member Ava Magee both in the district and as the Head Coach of our Girls Swimming program. Ava has done a wonderful job during the transition this summer, providing contact days, communication, and her vision with the athletes that we were able to add a couple new swimmers to the program this fall. The last two high school sports to get going are both starting on the same day, Monday August 19. Cross Country begins the year underneath the returning Great Northern Conference Coach of the year Connor Ahrens with their traditional Bond Falls Camp. The coaching staff, parents, and students have been preparing for this throughout the summer. When they return to Tomahawk, no rest for them as they host their annual Alumni Scrimmage at Bradley Park the following Saturday. The Girls team looks to defend their 2023 Great Northern Conference Championship with many key members returning, while the Boys team will be looking to regain our traditional power for our program this fall. That same day, a new, but familiar face, Keith Hanse, will begin his second stint as the Head Coach for the THS Volleyball Program. New this year in the WIAA, volleyball added a division, so it will be the first time Tomahawk is competing at the Division 3 level in the state of Wisconsin. With the new division, there comes new challenges to go along the traditionally strong Great Northern Conference schedule.
