Pre-K

This week in pre-k we will discuss what it means to be thankful and how we can show others we are thankful for them and the things they do for us. In math, we will learn about the attributes of common 2D shapes. In Literacy, we will continue listening to the ending sounds in words to recognize rhyming words, each letter of the alphabet has a name and represents a sound, recognizing environmental print to understand that words carry meaning, and retelling stories by using story pieces.

subtraction. Our lessons will take students through a concrete-representational-abstract progression as they work with objects, drawings, and number bonds. Students will use the counting on, making a ten, and taking from a ten strategy with drawings, number bonds, and number sentences to solve a variety of addition and subtraction problems. Students will also continue applying these strategies to addition and subtraction word problems.

Reading

We will continue with Unit 5 about Astronomy: Space Exploration. Students will develop an understanding of the sun being the closest star to planet Earth and planet Earth orbits around the sun. They will understand how the moon orbits around planet Earth. As students are learning all of these important facts from our read-alouds, students will be collecting information as they write sentences in their Astronomy Journals.

Skills

We will continue with unit 3 in skills this week. Students will continue to read from our unit decodable readers. The readers are 100% decodable, meaning they only use words and spellings that have been explicitly taught and practiced. Students will be answering written questions about the key details. We will continue to learn new vowel digraphs and review previously learned vowel digraphs. Students will also be reviewing nouns and verbs, including common and proper nouns. At the end of the week, we will be reviewing for our skills test that is scheduled for the week we return to school.

Social Studies:

We will be identifying and describing the physical characteristics of a place such as landforms, bodies of water, and earth's resources, and weather. We will also be able to describe how geographic location influences the human characteristics of a place, such as shelter, clothing, food, and activities.

2nd Grade

In Math we will be using mental strategies to relate compositions of 10 tens as 1 hundred to 10 ones as 1 ten. Students will use and relate manipulatives and drawings to represent additions with two compositions.

In Skills we will be learning spelling alternatives by introducing /aw/ "aw, au', and 'augh'. We will be planning, drafting, and editing a personal narrative. In Knowledge we will be listening to read alouds about cycles of nature to answer comprehension questions. We will be working with words: germination, replenished, burrow, transparent, and precipitation.

In Science we will measure, record, and graph weather information, including temperature. In Social Studies we will identify governmental services in the community such as police and fire protection, libraries, schools, and parks and explain their value to the community.



This week in Reading, we will linish our unit on Ancient Roman Civilization. We will read about Julius Caesar, the fall of Rome, and the creation of two new Romes. We will also be reading a fable called Androcles and the Lion. We will analyze the characteristics of this text. We will use our reading to make inferences, respond with text evidence, determine key ideas, and use context clues to determine meaning. In Math, we will use strategies to multiply a two digit by one number. We will also determine the unknown whole number in a multiplication or division equation relating three whole numbers when the unknown is either a missing factor or product. We will also recall multiplication facts with automaticity. We will determine if a number is even or odd using divisibility rules. In Science, we will continue with force and motion and in Social Studies we will work on maps. It's going to be a great week in third grade!

4th Grade

Early this week in ELAR, students will take their Unit 4 test on Monday. The test will cover making inferences, identifying text evidence to support answers, and using context clues. Later in the week, they will do reading activities to review important skills.

In Social Studies, students will learn about Texas's role in the Mexican War of Independence and how it helped shape the state's early history.

This week in Math, students will keep sharpening their long-division skills as they divide 2- and 3-digit numbers using the strategies they've been mastering recently.

In Science, students will continue to explore how energy is transferred in different ways—through moving objects, water waves, and sound. They'll investigate and identify how energy moves and changes form in these everyday examples.

5th Grade

ELAR:

We are diving deep into plot development and learning how authors build excitement and meaning in stories. Students will also work with present tense sentences and pronouns, explore the suffix "ness," and start building strong claims and evidence for their first persuasive essay. We will also uncover character traits and have fun identifying irony in three forms: verbal, situational, and dramatic.

At home: Ask your child to share their persuasive essay topic and let them "convince" you of their opinion. This helps them practice using evidence and reasoning.

Math:

It is all about fractions this week. Students will use models and number lines to add and subtract fractions with unlike denominators, then take their learning up a notch by reasoning through common denominators in more abstract ways. It is a fraction-tastic week ahead!

At home: Have your child help with cooking or measuring ingredients. Talking through how to combine different fractional amounts (like ½ cup plus ¼ cup) builds real-world understanding.

about types of energy, energy transformations, circuits, and now light reflects and reflects. Get ready for some bright conversations at home because these scientists are glowing with knowledge! **At home:** Ask your child to point out examples of energy in your home, such as a lamp (light energy) or a blender (mechanical energy). This helps connect classroom learning to everyday life.

Library

Next week in the library, we'll be focusing on the theme of **thankfulness** as we head into the Thanksgiving season. Students will enjoy a read-aloud of a story about **gratitude and kindness**, then take time to reflect on the many things—big and small—they are thankful for in their lives. Through purposeful conversations and creative activities, we'll practice listening, sharing, and celebrating the people, places, and moments that make us feel grateful.

It's a wonderful opportunity for our readers to connect stories with their own experiences and to appreciate the joy of giving thanks!
