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Rantoul City Schools Consolidated District Plan Summary School Year 2025-2026

The purpose of the Consolidated District Plan (CDP) is to streamline and align the use of multiple federal education funding sources—such as Titles I, II, III, IV, and IDEA—into a single, coordinated plan that supports district-wide goals for student achievement, equity, and school improvement.

Key Focus Areas:

- Academic Achievement: Continued implementation of the District's three-year Improvement Plan with a strong focus on literacy, mathematics, behavioral supports, crisis response, family engagement, and curricular/extracurricular program evaluation and expansion.
- Resource Alignment: Federal grants (Title I, II, III, IV, and IDEA) are strategically coordinated with local and state funds to maximize impact on student learning, teacher support, and safe school environments.
- Priority Populations: Targeted supports are prioritized for English Learners, students with disabilities, immigrant students, low-income students, and students requiring behavioral interventions.
- Parent and Community Engagement: RCS fosters strong family-school partnerships through regular engagement activities, multilingual communications, advisory committees, and parent education workshops.
- Professional Development: Training is provided in areas including structured literacy, trauma-informed practices, bilingual and dual-language instruction, behavior management, co-teaching, culturally responsive practices, and technology integration.
- Safe Learning Environments: Continued efforts to reduce bullying, minimize exclusionary discipline practices, enhance building security, and provide positive behavior supports across all schools.
- Early Childhood Coordination: Ongoing collaboration with Head Start programs and local daycares ensures smoother transitions for preschool students into kindergarten.
- Accelerated Learners: RCS offers an Accelerated Placement Program (APP) that provides opportunities for early entrance, subject acceleration, and grade-level advancement based on objective criteria.

Needs Assessment Highlights:

- Low proficiency rates in ELA and Math across all grade levels, with achievement gaps for Black male students, EL students, and students with disabilities.
- Continued need for enhanced behavioral supports, improved building safety, and greater family engagement.
- Strategic resource alignment remains critical to addressing identified student and staff needs.

Stakeholder Involvement:

• Input from teachers, administrators, paraprofessionals, parents, and community members directly shaped the plan's goals and activities through surveys, advisory committees, and consultation meetings.

• The district remains committed to ensuring equitable access to high-quality instruction, resources, and services for every student, with a focus on historically underserved groups.
