DHS DATA ASSESSMENT

2016-2017 SUMMARY 2017-2018 PREVIEW

In 2016, DHS juniors averaged a score of <u>877</u>, the state average was <u>1015</u>. In 2017, DHS juniors averaged a score of <u>972</u> and the state average was <u>1034</u>. Although the scores are still below the state average, there was an increase in the average DHS score of <u>95 points</u>. In addition, 31 students scored over <u>1000</u> and five students scored over <u>1300</u>.

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In your folders, you will see an email from Mike Kent, educational consultant who oversees our Alliance dashboard. Derby ranked first in ELA and MATH score change when compared to all other Alliance districts.

In 2015-2016, 31.4% of DHS students scored proficient on the SAT test in the area of ELA - In 2016-2017, 52.4% of students scored proficient - this represents a 21.0% change.

In 2015-2016, 15.1% of DHS students scored proficient on the SAT test in the area of Math - In 2016-2017, 27.2% of students scored proficient - this represents a 12.1% change.

Further Analysis:

In comparison to the rest of the state, DHS improved its ranking as well. We went from being ranked 9th from the bottom to 27th in ELA and 13th to 34th in Math.

Plans for 2017-2018:

DHS has developed a ten point action plan.
