How is it November already?! In October grades K-5 started to learn about/review Kelso's choices and dealing with conflict. Students worked on recognizing the size of the problem and worked on using Kelso's strategies for conflict resolution. We focused on using "I statements" in resolving conflicts with peers rather than blaming the other person. We will continue with Kelso's choice and conflict resolution in November. We also covered student safety k-5 with our Child Protection Unit from Second Step. Students learned about ways to stay safe with our "Never Never Rules" and the "Always Ask First Rule." I encourage you to ask your child about the different Kelso's choices and the never never rules, they know their stuff!



Additionally, in November we will continue to work on skills for learning: focused attention, listening, following directions, being assertive, empathy and more. We will continue developing using our 'tools' (Breathing, Listening & Words) to help in solving problems and staying in the green zone. Each month our PBIS team will be sharing something we have been working on to support positive student behavior at Nehalem Elementary School.

WHAT IS POSITIVE BEHAVIOR INTERVENTIONS and SUPPORT (PBIS)?

PBIS is a school-wide system that includes proactive strategies for defining, teaching, reinforcing and supporting appropriate student behaviors to create a positive school environment. Nehalem Elementary has been using PBIS since 2011.

NEHALEM EXPECTATIONS TRAINING BOOSTER (NET BOOSTER)

We do our NET Booster at the beginning of the year and after winter and spring breaks to make sure students know and practice the behaviors expected in each setting. All students rotate around the school through nonclassroom settings such as the cafeteria and the playground to learn the rules and expectations for each area. If students know the rules, then they are more likely to follow them. Students did great at our first NET Booster in September!








School Immunizations

Now is a great time to review vaccine records and make sure your student's vaccines are up to date. You may receive a notice from the school if our records indicate missing vaccinations.

The state of Oregon does allow medical and non-medical exemptions with the correct forms and educational viewings. Visit Oregon Immunizations for more information.

With the rise of communicable diseases such as whooping cough and measles, it is important to note that if your child is exempt from vaccines (unvaccinated) and active cases of communicable diseases occur in school, local public health authorities may temporarily exclude exposed unvaccinated students from school during active outbreaks. Keeping students in school is a priority for all of us. Speak to your healthcare provider about the best options for your student regarding vaccinations.

October Focus (Grades 2nd-5th):


- Throwing and Catching Skills and Games

Keeping Our Students Safe: Practice Makes Perfect

Keeping Our Students Safe: Practice Makes Perfect

At NES, the safety of our students and staff is always our top priority. As part of our commitment to maintaining a secure learning environment, we regularly practice various emergency drills throughout the school year.

These drills are essential because they ensure that everyone knows exactly what to do and where to go in the event of a real emergency. This preparation helps reduce panic and allows us to respond quickly, calmly, and efficiently.

Once a month your child will participate in one of the following essential drills:

• Earthquake Drill (Drop, Cover, and Hold On) & Tsunami Drill: Students practice immediately taking cover under a sturdy piece of furniture or against an interior wall, protecting their heads

and necks until the shaking stops. They then exit the building. Our school is outside of the tsunami zone.

- Fire Drill: The sound of the fire alarm means everyone must quickly and quietly exit the building using the nearest designated route and gather at their class's safe meeting spot.
- Lock In Drill: This drill prepares students for a threat inside the school. Classes move away from doors and windows, the lights are turned off, and the classroom is secured (locked). We use the example of a stray dog or animal inside the school building to talk about this drill with students.
- Lock Out Drill: This drill is used when there is a potential threat outside the school building out in the community. All outside activity stops, all exterior doors are locked, and normal class activity continues inside. We will be practicing the Lockout Drill later this month.
- Hold in Place Drill: This drill is used when we have a medical emergency on campus and need students and staff to clear the area and remain in their classrooms so our onsite emergency team can be released to manage the situation until EMS arrives.

We understand these drills can sometimes sound serious, but they are conducted calmly and positively, emphasizing that they are simply practice runs. Staff and students are trained beforehand, and we never do "surprise drills." Staff and students always know when they are scheduled, and they are part of our normal routine. Please feel free to discuss the importance of these drills with your child at home.
