Presentations/ Recognitions

Denton ISD recognized 12 seniors who have been honored for their high scores on the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT), an assessment taken by high school juniors nationwide. One senior from Denton High, Taerim Kim, has been named National Merit Semifinalist. He is among an elite group of only 1,600 semifinalists

throughout the United States who were named in the 2008 National

Merit Scholarship Program.

In addition to the semifinalist, Denton ISD had eight commended scholars. There were three commended scholars from Denton High, Benjamin Hokamp, Joseph Tucker, and Theodore Yan. There were two commended students from Guyer High, Mary Lockwood, and Callie Windle. There were three students from Ryan High who received letters of commendation, Stephanie Moor, Sarah Simington,

and Melanie Welch.

The district also had two students from Ryan High School who were named to the National Achievement Scholarship Program. They were Brittany Miles, who graduated early last year, and Ebonie Simpson.

From Ryan High, Chance M. Maggard was named as National

Hispanic Recognition Program Scholar Finalist.

The District recognized six elementary schools and one middle school that were named "Recognized:" To achieve "Recognized" standing, a school must receive 75 percent passing rates on all TAKS areas or 70 percent passing rate with required improvements, 70 percent SDAA II passage rate, and a .7 percent or less dropout rate in seventh and eighth grades. The seven schools named "Recognized" include: E.P. Rayzor Elementary School, Hawk Elementary School, Houston Elementary School, McNair Elementary School, Ryan Elementary School, Wilson Elementary School, and McMath Middle School.

Public Hearing on Freeport Exemption

In the 2007 session, the Texas Legislature passed HB 621. This bill exempts goods, (from being taxed) principally inventory, that are stored in a location that is not owned by the owner of the goods and are transferred from that location to another location within 175 days. Denton ISD must hold a public hearing on the question of whether to tax the goods or let them become exempt. These goods will become exempt in 2008 if no action is taken by the Board of Trustees prior to the end of 2007.

Discussion of Annual Financial Report for the Year Ending June 30, 2007 Carl Deaton, with Hankins, Eastup, Deaton, Tonn & Seay, Certified Public Accountants presented information to the Board regarding the Annual Financial Report for the year ending June 30, 2007.

An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation.

Discussion of Amending of 2007-2008 School Calendar A recent change by the Texas Education Agency was made to move all testing from February to March 2008, thus eliminating the need to have the staff development day prior to a week of testing. Moving the staff development day to February would allow our students to be dismissed in observance of President's Day on February, 28, 2008.

Discussion of 2008-2009 School Calendar Dr. Roger Rutherford presented the Trustees with a proposed school calendar for the 2008-2009 school year. This option has a start date of August 26, 2008 and the last day of school scheduled for June 4, 2009.

Discussion of Math Program Report Dr. Mike Mattingly, Asst. Supt. For Curriculum presented information regarding the District's mathematics performance.

This item is for information only. No action is required.

Discipline Report Jamie Wilson, Deputy Superintendent, presented information regarding the disciplinary actions taken during the 2006-2007 school year. TEA requires reporting of every disciplinary action that removes a student from the regular classroom or education placement for periods of one school day or more. Typically, this includes any action involving in-school suspension, out-of-school suspension, placement in a disciplinary alternative education program (DAEP), or expulsion from school. There are also requirements for reporting specific types of behavior for analysis by the Safe and Drug Free Schools Division of TEA, which administers state and federal grant money. This data has been compared with the previous five years and will be the basis for future efforts to improve discipline within our schools.

The most commonly used disciplinary action resulting in removal of students from the regular educational placement was In-school suspension. There were 4,410 incidences of students being placed in ISS for one or more school days, out-of-school suspension was utilized 1,760 times, 357 students were placed in DAEP and 5 students were expelled to JJAEP.

Residential Facility Monitoring Report TEA requires that districts maintain an online report known as Residential Facility (RF) Tracker. This RF tracker report requires input of all residential students' demographic information, the input of enrollment and withdrawal dates, input of teacher's demographics (this includes all general education and special education teachers-including their highly qualified status-who work with this identified target group, as well as information related to service providers (employee/contract)).

The purpose of the monitoring visit (April 2007) is to satisfy a complaint brought against the TEA. TEA conducted a random visit during the week of April 24, 2007. This visit included focus

meetings with administrators, service providers, facility staff, and parents/surrogate parents as well as a review of students' eligibility folders.
