Parent Teacher Conferences

In November we held our first quarter parent teacher conferences. We had a great turn out of families coming to the school to visit with their child's teacher.

2023-24 School Focus

We continue to stay focused on our four focuses with the goal of refining our action steps to meet these focuses. These are:

- 1. Science of Reading
- 2. Science of Writing/Handwriting
- 3. Math plan following Mary Buck's guidance
- 4. Social Emotional Learning with Conscious Discipline & DESSA

Science of Reading

Our focus has been on student engagement using opportunities to respond, pacing, and routines. Teachers have been provided professional development on how to increase this in the classroom to increase engagement. Walkthroughs in the classroom show high engagement by students.

In the Tier one literacy block, teachers are explicitly teaching students the phoneme sounds, phonics patterns and teaching students language to increase their reading proficiency.

Science of Writing

We have been implementing Handwriting without Tears since October. In this short time, we are seeing a positive impact in students' legible handwriting when writing stories. Research shows that when students learn how to write the letters with explicit instruction, it frees up their working memory. As a result their writing increases because they are no longer focused on how to form their letters.

Attendance by Shanna LittleDog-Leon

We have incentives every month for our students who have 90% or better attendance. For our November incentive, the students who earned this, watched a movie and ate popcorn. For our December incentive we are having hot chocolate and candy canes. on Nov. 13th using AimswebPlus Reading. They completed two second quarter PDSA cycles for their WIN group. By using the digital record form from AimswebPlus to progress monitor, teachers are able to begin seeing a trend line for each individual student that informs them to see who is progressing with instruction and if the intervention is working.

Teachers agreed upon a lesson plan template and collaboratively spent time updating the lesson components for each subject area. This planning has everyone engaging with one another to better support student achievement and instruction.

Walkthrough trends indicate the need to revisit the error correction routine during WIN time of SIPPS for intervention. PD was given on Nov. 17th to support teachers to bring focus to error correction using Anita Archer's book "Explicit instruction" chapter 7.

Teachers also during the grade level meeting updated grade level planning calendars and templates they worked on at SBE. Along with sharing positives from parents during parent teacher conferences. Teachers also looked within AimswebPlus to look at progress monitoring data for their homeroom students to see who is monitored with Phoneme Segmentation, Nonsense Word Fluency, or Oral Reading fluency. Teachers collaborated about their student growth or lack of growth due to attendance, or other factors contributing to student growth.

We look forward to our January benchmark data growth!


BES Book Fair by Shawnee Skunkcap
