

Raptor System

From November to January 17, 2023, over 23,000 visitors signed in to various campuses.

The District Safety Committee completed mock visits to ensure all campuses are completing required weekly sweeps and visitors are directed to the main office to check-in.

Silent Panic Alert System

Exceptions to the locked and closed exterior door rule:

An exterior door may **be left unlocked** if it falls under the <u>following exceptions</u>:

- **a. Actively Monitored:** refers to protection of a specific area of a school or school facility <u>by a person</u> whose primary duty is to identify and take immediate actions needed to prevent unauthorized entry or activity, or within an
- **b.** Exterior Secured Area: an area fully enclosed by a fence and/or wall that:
 - (1) <u>is at least 6 feet high</u> and has design features that prevent it from being easily scalable (such as stone, wrought iron, chain link with slats/wind screen or chain link topped with an anti-scaling device) or is at least 8 feet high,
 - (2) that is well maintained, and
 - (3) if gated, features locked gates with emergency egress hardware and has features to prevent opening from exterior without a key or combination mechanism.

Safety Ventilation: for the purposes of maintaining appropriate interior temperature and air quality conducive to a healthy learning environment, an overhead door (example: barn, shop, gymnasium, or garage) <u>may be left open as long as it is either actively monitored or within a secured area.</u>





TEA School Safety Standards

Cost Estimate Survey

The survey asks the following:

- The average age of instruction facilities
- District enrollment
- 3. Last bond or major renovation
- 4. Total number of campuses
- 5. Exterior Secure Area Fencing (Total Linear Footage and estimated cost)
- Exterior Door Components (Number of Doors that need an upgrade and rekeying to create a master key)
- Exterior Glass Doors (Doors that need glass reinforcement and total square footage of window film)
- 8. Windows (Cost to reinforce widows near doors)
- 9. Communication Infrastructure (two-way radios)
- 10. Silent Panic Alert Technology
- 11. Exterior Door Numbering
- 12. Exterior Master key Box
