GETTING STUDENTS BACK ON TRACK

The pandemic has made falling behind on credits much easier to do.

- × Students get a little behind
- × Then a little further behind
- Eventually some get to a point where catching up seems impossible.

GETTING STUDENTS BACK ON TRACK

We are working to make it possible for them to get back on track for graduation.

- We are addressing this need through expanded credit recovery opportunities.
 - Offering students a learning environment that they are academically supported by certified staff and held accountable for their attendance and engagement.
 - x After school credit recovery class are maxed at 20
 - X Academic intervention rooms during the school day have no more than 12 students.

 We are providing before and after school tutoring for students.







- 2019-2020 school year, 23.4% students had missed 3 or more days at this same time in the school year.


