Analysis

Successes:

- The Early Warning System (EWS) developed by our District's I.T. Department was successfully used by Beaverton High School to identify attendance concerns of students

Issues:

- The use of EWS is not consistent at secondary schools as a tool to enhance student to staff relationship. A system for intervening with a student based on the EWS data has not yet been developed
- Lack of staff who reflect the diversity of student demographics
- No system for reporting and accountability for students attending the former in-district GED and PCC Links Programs

Action Plan

This year:

- EWS will be used at all secondary schools
- Implementation of 9th grade and 8th grade AVID elective classes at all secondary schools to increase student to teacher relationship
- Collaboration between Outreach and Engagement, Passages Program and PCC Links Programs through a system of reporting absences in order to recapture non-attending students

Long-term:

- The use of EWS will help develop system-wide interventions
- Implementation of AVID Elective Class at all grade levels at secondary schools will increase the number of students reporting they have an adult who care about them
- Possible expansion of the Passages Program to specifically address our highest risk students
