On behalf of the American Federation of Teachers' executive council, we are pleased to confirm your two-year appointment (2024-2026) to the AFT's Native American Taskforce. Human rights, community engagement, and social justice has always been central to the AFT's values and work, and this task force leads the union's efforts to address the needs of Native Americans in the United States.

The Native American community is part of the diverse membership of the AFT from school support staff, teachers, public employees, faculty and health care workers. We represent more than 7,000 members of the Federation of Indian Service Employees (FISE) across the country. While most of them are in Bureau of Indian Education (BIE) schools, there are many members represented by FISE who work in public safety, water protection, oil, and gas with similar titles to the public workers in state and local government. and it's critically important that we address the unique needs impacting Native Americans throughout the United States.

The work of the AFT's Native American Taskforce is guided by its mission statement to raise the visibility and urgency of issues impacting Native American members and students within the union and to provide national leadership to help ensure that the needs of the growing Native American community are addressed where they live and across all settings where AFT members work: in schools, public institutions, hospitals, and institutions of higher education.
