Academic Leadership Council Committee

PreK/Elementary

- The committee discussed the process for selecting resources for interventions. Any resources that will support interventions for our students will follow a similar process to our core resource review. A final recommendation and approval will be requested by ALC once we have a recommendation to bring to the group.
- We reviewed the [5 Essentials Pulse Survey Data](#) on Program Coherence from this winter. A survey was sent to staff to gather feedback on how we can improve in this area. We reviewed the feedback in small groups.
- At the September ALC meeting, one suggestion to improve the area of Program Coherence was to develop a D33 Program Guide. The tentative "Program Guide" was reviewed. Additionally, the committee reviewed the definition of "program" from the survey. We will continue to review the definitions developed by the committee at the January ALC meeting to refine them further.
- The committee discussed the validation survey for curriculum and determined we would continue with the current survey for the remainder of the year. We will review and revise accordingly for next year.
- The committee discussed grading and reporting. It was determined that T&L would establish a subcommittee to explore grading practices in greater detail. We will bring the next steps to the next ALC.
- Teaching and Learning proposed to the committee that PreK should have a separate Academic Leadership Council to focus on their needs specifically. The committee reached consensus to create a PreK Academic Leadership Council. Teaching and Learning will be attending the PreK Faculty Meeting next week to discuss the next steps.

Leman

- Jenny Brunke provided an update on the MyPerspectives Pilot at Leman Middle School. [This presentation](#) was presented to the Board of Education in November.
- The committee discussed the process for selecting resources for interventions. Feedback on Recognition Table pilot at IK & Feel Good Friday/Folders for principals: Not much interest in either - we recommend shifting to a more authentic way to recognize, that adds on to existing work.

Ideas generated:

1. **Board Salutes:** We've added Portrait qualities and a more consistent way of reading salutes at board meetings to make recognitions more personal and student-connected.
2. **Spotlight Videos:** Add a personalized staff or student shout out at the end to incorporate recognition.
3. **End of the Year Awards:** In addition to honoring Retirees & Milestone Year Achievers, add "Portrait in Action" awards - what could this look like by school or district-wide? MVPs – potential Google Form + future business partnerships/raffles.
4. **Badging Pilot:** Identify schools to test staff & student digital badges.
