I. News

- A.** As part of the Leopards Learn Conference, Faculty Council organized a Great Ideas for Teaching Students (i.e., GIFTS) session, which consists of brief presentations designed to be of practical use. Following is a list of participants and descriptions of GIFTS shared during the session.
- Rebecca Sader—"Cowabunga! Thesis Statements are Easy!"
Professor Sader's GIFT uses the Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles to create a thesis statement for a persuasive paper, covering the process from brainstorming about the topic, narrowing the topic, and drafting a thesis statement, to revising the thesis.
 - Melissa Green—"Less Intimidating, More Approachable"
Professor Green's GIFT introduces simple ways to increase communication, interest, and academic collegiality in the classroom, all while meeting students at their level.
 - Christine Simon—"Professional Interview Assignment"
Dr. Simon's GIFT asks students to interview a professional in the field of Child Psychology to gain a deeper understanding of the challenges and rewards associated with different roles, which helps students connect theoretical knowledge with real-world practices.
- B.** TCCTA should release the annual Faculty Salary Survey within the month. Last year, it was not published until January 23. Previously, it had been released much earlier. I hope to report on this during the February meeting.
