

#### The Role of a Board Member within the District Leadership Team

The workshop will focus on how you, as a board member, function within the framework of district governance and leadership. As a member of the school board you have chosen to serve your community in a unique way and together we will dive into what that means. We will spend our time in this workshop answering some of the fundamental questions of school board service; What are your duties? What is the relationship between the board and the superintendent? What is your relationship with other board members? How do I communicate with patrons, staff, and the other board members? What do we do before, during, and after the meeting? Finally, we will answer the most important question "How many board members does it take to screw in a lightbulb?"

#### **Sustainable Safety Plans**

The board is the authority when it comes to school safety but how do you and your team create a lasting safety plan? #### Fiduciary Responsibility and Governing Boards

State and federal code contain many areas relevant to the board and its oversight of the funding of the district or charter school. When using taxpayer funding to create educational programs, it is important that the board have all the information it needs to find a balance between the funding concerns and providing the best opportunities possible for the students it serves. In this workshop, we will review needed resources, questions you should ask, and procedures available to districts and charters in becoming responsible fiduciary agents.
