Minutes of Regular Meeting

The Board of Trustees Palestine ISD

A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of Palestine ISD was held Monday, July 22, 2019, beginning at 6:00 PM in the Palestine ISD Administrative Offices Board Room, 1007 East Park Avenue, Palestine, Texas 75801.

President Bennett called the meeting to order and announced that a quorum was present.

A motion was made by Trustee Sheeley, seconded by Trustee Tutt, and unanimously approved by the Board, that the Board convene in closed session at 6:00 PM in accordance with the Tex. Govt. Code Sect. 551.001, Texas Revised Statutes. Motion carried 6-0.

President Bennett opened the regular meeting at 7:04 PM and stated that no action was taken in closed session.

President Bennett gave the invocation.

Pledges of allegiance were recited to the American and Texas flags.

Spotlight

Palestine Fire Department

Palestine ISD honored the Palestine Fire Department for all they do for the community and schools. Superintendent Marshall thanked the Palestine Fire Department for all that they do to protect the community and for keeping the school district informed of safety issues.

Brian Homann spoke regarding a New York field trip opportunity for PHS Choir students.

Financial Update

David Atkeisson, Chief Financial Officer, presented a brief financial update.

- Tax Collections above 100%
- District continuing to review investments to ensure best interest rates possible

Budget Workshop

David Atkeisson, Chief Financial Officer, presented the following information during a Budget Workshop for the 2019-2020 school year:

- 2019 Legislative Session having a positive effect on school finance.
- General fund (199) budget for the 2019-2020 school year projected at approximately \$34 million.
- PISD teacher pay to be increased approximately \$6,000 on average.
- PISD support staff pay to be increased approximately 10-15%.
- House Bill 3 requiring school districts to compress tax rates, therefore the district would be proposing a lower total tax rate for 2019-2020.
- 2019-2020 possible expenditures include adding a Fire Academy to the CTE Pathway, increase in safety and security measures, and addition of 1 school bus.
- Mr. Atkeisson noted that although the tax rate would be lower in 2019-2020, increased property values were expected to be higher. Therefore, property taxes may not be lower for homes/businesses that increased in value.

Proposed Tax Rate

David Atkeisson, Chief Financial Officer, informed the Board regarding the proposed property tax rate for 2019-2020. The proposed tax rate amount is \$0.1016 less than the 2018-2019 tax rate. A motion was made by Trustee Sokolowski, seconded by Trustee Herrington to approve a proposed tax rate of \$1.0684 for maintenance and operations and \$0.36 for interest and sinking, a total proposed tax rate of \$1.4284 for the 2019-2020 school year. Motion carried 7-0.
