COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is a competency based program designed to introduce students to basic woodworking and manufacturing concepts using wood and wood products. Course coverage will include shop math, hand tools, limited power tools, shop safety, knowledge of wood products and producing basic products.

COURSE GOALS:

Students will:

- 1. Explore the various areas of woods manufacturing.
- 2. Develop the basic skills necessary to safely operate a variety of hand and power tools.
- 3. Learn about and practice shop safety.
- 4. Develop a vocabulary and understanding of terms used in a wood shop.

ASSESSMENT STRATEGIES:

Oral and written responses, lab activities, guizzes, tests and completion of shop projects.
