Greetings,

Things are off to a fantastic start here at Fleming. We are very pleased to return with another great year of improvement under our belts, and look forward to continuing the trend. As you probably already know, Fleming has once again been rated "Outstanding" on the 2010-2011 Oregon School Report Card. This is unprecedented in Southern Oregon and a rarity for any middle school /secondary school in the state. In fact, according to my own research, Fleming is the only middle school in the entire state to have received either an exceptional or outstanding rating for 5 years in a row. It is my sincere belief that the continued success that we have seen here at FMS is because of an exceptional group of staff, students and community members that come together to make Fleming special. The most important piece of our success during this time has been the commitment our entire staff has made toward achieving and exceeding our school-wide improvement goals. I am truly thankful for their professionalism and dedication. Through a continued reevaluation of instructional practices, curricular alignment, and disciplinary best practices, this team has established a very positive focus for the education of our children and is committed to continuing our upward climb.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT MEDICATIONS

When your child must take prescription and/or non-prescription medicine at school, please follow these steps.

- The parent/guardian must bring the medicine in person to the office and fill out a medication administration form. Additionally, the parent/ guardian must pick up the container when the child has completed the course of medication.
- Medicine must be in its original container.
- The parent/guardian must fill out the appropriate form with instructions/ permission for the school to administer the medication.
- The parent/guardian must inform the school in writing of any changes in medication instructions.

At no time may a student be in possession of either prescription or non-prescription medications while at school. All medications must be administered through the office. The only exception to this policy are students who must have inhalers or other medications with them because of life-threatening conditions. The office <u>MUST</u> be notified if your child is in this category. There are forms in the office for you to complete if your child requires medication at school.



ATTENTION PARENTS OF 7th GRADERS

Oregon Law added new requirements for immunizations as of the 2010/2011 school year. All 7th graders who have not met the requirement need to have one additional vaccine or an appropriate medical or religious exemption. Please check your child's records to be sure he/she has the following:

Tdap Vaccine – 1 dose

Tdap offers protection against three serious diseases: Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis (whooping cough). The Tdap vaccine is given to adolescents and adults 10-64 years old. It is different from the DTaP, which is given to children younger than 7 years. Your student will need one dose of Tdap if it has been at least five years since receiving their last Tetanus containing vaccine. If your student does not have the Tdap shot, contact your child's doctor or call the Josephine County Health Department (541) 474-5353 to make an appointment.

It is important to get an early start on updating your child's immunization information. All updated information should be sent to Fleming Middle School. If you have any questions you can call (541) 476-8284 and talk to Maria at Fleming.

Note from your Family Advocate,

My name is Jolie Kern, and I am Fleming's family advocate. As family advocate, I can assist students whose families are unable to provide what is needed for them to be successful in school. I can often help with school supplies, clothing, hygiene items, glasses, haircuts and much more. I can also help by providing academic support to students in homeless situations or living situations that are less than adequate. The federal government defines "homeless" as:

Living in a home with no heat or running water Staying with friends or relatives due to economic hardship or loss of housing fleeing a domestic violence situation Living in camp grounds due to lack of alternative adequate accommodations Sleeping in a public or private place not intended for living in. (cars and garages) Living in substandard housing, parks or abandoned houses If you are in need of my assistance please fill out the "request for advocate contact" attached.
