RE: Crisis Management/Emergency Action

Plans

Policy 806: Crisis Management requires annual review and approval of district Crisis Management/Emergency Action plans.

There are a number of changes to this year's plans. Changes were made to comply with updates to policy 806 and to reflect the district's decision to adopt the Standard Response Protocol as its general emergency response strategy.

A summary of changes are provided below:

- 1. The adoption of three crisis/emergency response teams
 - District Emergency Response Team provides oversight of emergency policy and plans and may perform a district level incident command role in a district level emergency.
 - Building Emergency Response Team provides oversight of building level procedures and training. Also performs as building level incident command in the event of an emergency.
 - Building Medical Emergency Response Team Respond to medical emergencies until emergency responders arrive
- 2. The addition of language to clarify emergency response communication protocols including communication tools (cell phones, dispatch radios, overhead intercom, Crisis Go, and Thrillshare).
- 3. The addition of The Standards Response Protocol (SRP) as the district's general crisis response strategy.
