AGENDA ITEM: Consider Adoption of Health I Curriculum

PRESENTER: Scott Kessel, Executive Director of Student Services

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

- The State Board of Education (SBOE) issues a proclamation to call for new instructional materials. The proclamation lists the subject areas scheduled for review.
- The SBOE issued *Proclamation 2022* at its April 2020 meeting to call for health and physical education instructional materials. The adoption of materials under *Proclamation 2022* occurred in November 2021.
- Only one option, materials published by Goodheart-Willcox, were added to the Commissioner's List of Adopted Curriculum and therefore are available for adoption. These adopted materials are scheduled to go into classrooms in the 2022–23 school year.
- As part of the adoption process, Aledo ISD uses an advisory committee to help preview the materials and make recommendations for board approval. The Aledo ISD School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) served as the Proclamation 2022 Advisory Committee.
- Standards for physical education are covered through activity-based instruction and therefore, no print-based materials are needed. Health standards for grades K-7 are covered through physical education classes.
- Print materials for the high school credit Health I course are needed to provide teachers with updated resources covering the revised health standards. The Health I Curriculum does not include sex education.
- Proclamation 2022 Action Plan:
 - April:
 - The curriculum is shared with Aledo ISD health teachers, Aledo ISD Board of Trustees, and Aledo ISD SHAC to gather feedback of the proposed Health I materials
 - May:
 - A SHAC meeting was held to discuss the proposed Health I materials
 - Community wide notice was sent by the district sharing the proposed Health I curriculum would be available for public viewing and feedback
 - Display the Goodheart-Willcox Health I curriculum for public comment May 9-13, 2022
 - The proposed Health I curriculum was made available to anyone who asked to view the content even after May 13, 2022
