619 STAFF DEVELOPMENT FOR STANDARDS

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to establish opportuni es for staff development which advance the staff's ability to work effec vely with the Gradua on Assessment Requirements and with students as they progress to achievement of those Gradua on Assessment Requirements and meet the requirements of federal law.

II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

The school district is commi ed to developing staff policies and processes for con nuous improvement of curriculum, instruc on and assessment to ensure effec ve implementa on of the Gradua on Assessment Requirements and federal law at all levels.

III. STANDARDS FOR STAFF DEVELOPMENT

- A. The Advisory Commi ee for Comprehensive Con nuous Improvement of Student Achievement (the CIA Commi ee"Commi ee") shall address the needs of all staff in priori zing staff development which will ensure effec ve implementa on of the Gradua on Assessment Requirements and federal law at all levels. The Commi ee will advise the school board on the planning of staff development opportuni es.
- B. The school district shall place a high priority on staff development including ac vi es, programs, and other efforts to implement the Gradua on Assessment Requirements effec vely and to upgrade that implementa on con nuously.
- C. Staff development plans for the school district shall address iden fied needs for Gradua on Assessment Requirements implementa on throughout all levels of the school district programs.
- D. In service, staff mee ng, and district and building level staff development plans and programs shall focus on improving implementa on of the Gradua on Assessment Requirements at all levels for all students, including those with special needs.

IV. TRAINING AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

A. <u>Paraprofessionals</u>. The school district will provide each paraprofessional who assists a licensed teacher in providing student instruc on with ini al training. Such training will include training in emergency procedures, confiden ality, vulnerability, repor ng obliga ons, discipline, policies, roles and responsibili es, and building orienta on. Training will be provided within the first 60 days a paraprofessional begins supervising or working with students.



Addi onally, with regard to paraprofessionals providing support to special educa on students, the school district will ensure that annual training opportuni es are required to enable the paraprofessional to further develop the knowledge and skills that are specific to the students with whom the paraprofessional works, including understanding disabili es, the unique and individual needs of each student according to the student's disability and how the disability affects the student's educa on and behavior, following lesson plans, and implemen ng followup instruc onal procedures and ac vi es.

B. Teachers/Administrators

The school district will provide high quality and ongoing professional development ac vi es as required by state and federal laws.
