HOMEBOUND INSTRUCTION PROGRAM

HOME HOSPITAL SERVICES NON-DISABLED GENERAL EDUCATION STUDENTS

The Board of Education may provide, pursuant to rules of the State Board of Education, individual instruction to students who are unable to attend classes for a period of ten (10) consecutive school days because of accident, illness, or disability.

Applications for individual instruction shall be approved by the Assistant Superintendent of Student Services, and shall be supported by documentation of the disabling condition prepared by a physician licensed to practice in Illinois.

The program of homebound instruction given each student shall be in accordance with rules of the Illinois School Code with such exceptions as may be recommended by the IEP Team. Teachers shall hold an Illinois teaching certificate.

A student may be entitled to receive educational services at home or in a hospital if it is anticipated that s/he will be unable to attend school for two or more consecutive weeks, or on an ongoing intermittent basis, due to a medical condition. The goal of home/hospital instruction is to reasonably support and continue a student's education during an extended absence and to enable the student to return to the classroom.

The Superintendent, or designee, is authorized and directed to develop procedures to implement the requirements of this policy.
