4 Policy Name: *School Wellness*

5 Regulation:

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7 The School District is committed to providing school environments that promote and protect
8 children's health, well-being, and ability to learn, by supporting healthy eating and physical activity.
9 Therefore, it is the policy of the School District that:

- 10 • The School District will engage students, parents, teachers (especially teachers of physical education),
11 food service professionals, school health professionals and other interested community members in
12 developing, implementing, monitoring, and reviewing District-wide nutrition and physical activity
13 policies and procedures.
- 14 • All students in grades K-12 will have opportunities, support, and encouragement to be physically active
15 on a regular basis.
- 16 • The School District will inform and update the public every 3 years, at a minimum, (including parents,
17 students, and others in the community) about the content and implementation of the local wellness
18 policies. The District will also measure periodically and make available to the public an assessment of the
19 local wellness policy, including:
 - 20 ✓ The extent to which schools are in compliance with the local wellness policy;
 - 21 ✓ The extent to which the LEA's local wellness policy compares to model local school wellness
22 policies; and
 - 23 ✓ The progress made in attaining the goals of the local wellness policy.
- 24 • Foods and beverages sold or served at school will meet the nutrition recommendations of the *U.S.*
25 *Dietary Guidelines for Americans*.
- 26 • Qualified child nutrition professionals will provide students with access to a variety of affordable,
27 nutritious, and appealing foods which meet the health and nutrition needs of students; will accommodate
28 the religious, ethnic, and cultural diversity of the student body in meal planning; and will provide clean,
29 safe, and pleasant settings and adequate time for students to eat.
- 30 • To the maximum extent practicable, all schools in the District will participate in available federal school
31 meal programs, including the School Breakfast Program and the National School Lunch Program
32 (including after-school snacks).
- 33 • Schools will provide nutrition education and physical education to foster lifelong habits of healthy eating
34 and physical activity and will establish linkages between health education and school meal programs and
35 with related community services.

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37 The Superintendent or his/her designee will develop procedures based on the following five (5) areas
38 of requirement:

- 39 1. Nutrition Education Goals
- 40 2. Physical Activity Goals
- 41 3. Nutrition Standards for All Foods and Beverages
- 42 4. Other School-Based Wellness Activities
- 43 5. Governance and Evaluation
