Modified Diplomas, Extended Diplomas and Certificates of Completion

When pursuit of the district's regular graduation requirements are inappropriate for a student the school and parents may develop a plan for the student to earn a Three Rivers School District (TRSD) Modified Diploma, Extended Diploma, or Certificate of Completion. Students earning either a Modified Diploma, Extended Diploma, or Certificate of Completion are included in all graduation activities organized by the school. Student transcripts show completion of the Modified Diploma, Extended Diploma, or Certificate of Completion. The Modified Diploma Plan includes clear objectives for the student and should be written by the end of grade ten.

Modified Diploma

A modified diploma will be awarded to students who have demonstrated the inability to meet the full set of academic standards established by the State Board of Education for a diploma while receiving reasonable modifications and accommodations. To be eligible for a modified diploma a student must:

- 1. While in grade nine through completion of high school, complete 24 credits which shall include:
 - a. Three credits in English;
 - b. Two credits in mathematics;
 - c. Two credits in science;
 - d. Two credits in social sciences;
 - e. One credit in health;
 - f. One credit in physical education; and
 - g. One credit in career technology, the arts or a second language.
- 2. Have a documented history of an inability to maintain grade level achievement due to significant learning and instructional barriers; or
- 3. Have a documented history of a medical condition that creates a barrier to achievement.

Eligibility for Modified Diploma

- 1. Student's disability or other individual limitation makes completion of state and district graduation requirements unattainable, even with accommodations and services.
- 2. Student and/or parents are aware of the requirements and timelines for earning the Modified Diploma and how that differs from a standard diploma track.
- 3. A student with a Modified Diploma Plan remains eligible for a standard diploma if standard district requirements are met.

4. An IDEA (Individuals with Disabilities Education Act) eligible student with a modified diploma remains eligible for special education services until age 21.

Extended Diploma

An extended diploma will be awarded to students who have demonstrated the inability to meet the full set of academic content standards for a diploma while receiving modifications and accommodations. To be eligible for an extended diploma, a student must:

- 1. While in grade nine through completion of high school, complete 12 credits, which may not include more than six credits in a self-contained special education classroom and will include:
 - a. Two credits of mathematics;
 - b. Two credits of English;
 - c. Two credits of science;
 - d. Three credits of history, geography, economics or civics;
 - e. One credit of health;
 - f. One credit of physical education;
 - g. One credit of the arts or a second language.
- 2. Have a documented history of an inability to maintain grade level achievement due to significant learning and instructional barriers; or
- 3. Have a documented history of a medical condition that creates a barrier to achievements; and
- 4. Participate in an alternate assessment beginning no later than grade six and lasting for two or more assessment cycles; or
- 5. Have a serious illness or injury that occurs after grade eight, that changes the student's ability to participate in grade level activities and that results in the student participating in alternate assessments.

Certificate of Completion

The Certificate of Completion is available for students whose disabilities or individual limitations prevent them from pursuing either a standard diploma or a modified diploma.

Eligibility for Certificate of Completion

- 1. Student must be at least 18 years old.
- 2. Student's disability or individual limitation makes completion of state and district graduation requirements unattainable, even with accommodations and services.
- 3. Student's disability or individual limitation makes completion of Modified Diploma requirements unattainable.
- 4. Requirements and timelines are explained to student and/or parents and how Certificate differs from a standard diploma track.

- 5. A student with a Certificate of Completion may continue to work toward a standard diploma. If the standard diploma is achieved, the record of the Certificate will be removed from the transcript.
- 6. An IDEA eligible student with a Certificate of Completion remains eligible for special education services until age 21.

Certificate of Completion Plan for Individual Education Plan (IEP) Students

- 1. Must be approved by the IEP Team.
- 2. "Certificate of Completion" indicated on the IEP cover sheet.
- 3. Defines specific expectations and timelines tied to IEP goals.
- 4. To the extent possible, student and parent are involved in creating the plan and updated on progress at least annually.
- 5. Copies to principal, counselor, student and parent.
