Provide an objective and the nurrose of the project

General purpose of the project:

To increase student achievement by developing a growth mindset in students

Describe the project and how it will enhance the learning environment and promote academic excellence.

Project Synopsis:

Carol Dweck's research has shown that students who have a growth mindset persevere through adversity and achieve better in school and life. Researchers have also found that it is possible to promote a growth mindset by teaching students about neuroscience evidence showing that the brain is malleable and gets stronger through effort, trying new strategies, and seeking help when necessary. In other words, making students conscious that a growth mindset will help them, really does help them achieve. We believe by teaching students the benefits of a growth mindset, coupled literature -- a memoir, The Last Lecture, and poems and short stories with a growth mindset message -- they will have more grit and determination to achieve over the long term. This curriculum is intended to piggy back on the freshman English curriculum which emphasizes organization and social skills. While the growth mindset curriculum officially lasts approximately a quarter, teachers will continue to encourage students to think in a growth mindset and apply it to new works of literature throughout the year. The key is to change their belief system about intelligence. If students think their intelligence is "malleable" then they are more likely to persist in the face of failure. Failure becomes a learning opportunity.

Teaching about growth mindset is also a fabulous way to encourage and assess growth outcomes that are aspects of the "Portrait of a Graduate"

from the Amphitheater School District. Having a growth mindset fosters in students all of the details of our graduate that might not normally be assessed as academic content can. For instance, in a growth mindset group activity on positive affirmation, collaboration and caring are necessary and assessable. In an escape room activity, problem solving and collaboration are at a premium. While writing an essay on a poem that exemplifies growth mindset puts a premium on academic skills, it also requires communication and creative thinking.

The Last Lecture is a memoir written by Carnegie Mellon professor, Randy Pausch. Written while he was dying of pancreatic cancer, his "last lecture" at the university was taped and went viral on YouTube, inspiring people to thank Dr. Pausch for helping change their outlook on life. I have taught this book in the past and almost unequivocally students from seventh grade through college age have been inspired by it. Non-readers ask to borrow copies of the book to take home. Randy's simple, yet profound writing style moves people to examine their own lives.

Students will be assessed on their completion of the Growth Mindset workbook materials, as well as their ability to apply growth mindset thinking to works of literature and their own lives through reflective journals, quizzes and tests, and formal writing.

Once the class sets of *The Last Lecture* are purchased and installed in the classroom, they should last a number of years. There may need to be replacement copies purchased occasionally. In addition, the workbook materials and use licenses will be good forever. We will have copies of the materials and only need to make workbook copies for the students each year through graphics and printing.
