Action Plan Steps and Expenditures

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- 1. Purchase Chromebooks and a Promethean Board for more interactive whole class reading instruction.
- 2. Continue to train new teachers in effective use of reading literacy apps for the individual devices such as Imagine Reading and Lexia in order to help strengthen student reading skills.
- 3. Purchase reading program Reading A-Z, to help students on their individual levels.
- 4. Purchase reading manipulatives using a teacher-grant system. These manipulatives will be utilized for hands-on instruction and discovery strategies in reading.
- 5. Hire a part-time reading tutor. Train the tutor in the STAR Reading Program. The tutor will work with teachers to identify students in need, train volunteers, and implement the reading program.
- 6. Money will be provided to teachers to help purchase materials for Tier I instruction in the areas of English language arts, math, and /or science. This can include standards-based field trips.

- 3. Continue to train teachers in the effective use of mathematical apps for the individual technology devices such as Dreambox and STMath and mathematical manipulatives.
- 4. Purchase Acadience Math for 4th and 5th grade. Assess all students at the beginning, middle, and end of the year. Students at risk of falling below math level will receive

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RTI in small groups, and individually. These students will be progress monitored using the Acadience Next software.
