5. Current Student Enrollment:

- a. Total number of students enrolled: 338 total for Madrona with 6 of these students enrolled in Three Rivers Virtual Online School (TVOS)
- Review current enrollment and discuss class sizes.
 - Feedback from members:
 - Mrs. Gutierrez stated that having smaller class sizes is beneficial for teaching foundational skills at the primary grade level.
 - 2. Having a PE teacher is a wonderful addition to our licensed staff to support physical education instruction. In addition, the PE instructional period provides embedded teacher time for PLC work, data meetings, and team meetings.

- The team discussed the concern regarding the roll up for class size from kindergarten to first grade. The team discussed the need for an additional first grade teacher and/or additional classified staff to support foundational skills for students with a smaller class size.
- 4. The team discussed a concern regarding students with self regulation/behavior situations that occur during the day and the staff available to support students. The team discussed a need for some more skills training support and/or additional adult support with social skills through a self-regulation room (The Hive)

6. Questions/Concerns discussed:

- a. Idea to help increase parental involvement was discussed with possibly holding PTSG meetings later in the day as parents are working (5:30 or later)
- b. Providing a well rounded educational experience with having a music program. Mr. Stacy stated he is very interested in helping bring music instruction back to Madrona. He offered to support writing grants and/or teaching part-time next year for music instruction.
