What is School-Linked Mental Health (SLMH)?

*A partnership with community providers to offer mental health treatment at school sites.

*SLMH services are available to all students. *Services are flexible to meet the needs of students and families. *Grant funds may be available to cover the costs of services. *With added services for students, they do better socially, academically, and behaviorally.

The **GOAL** of School- Linked Mental Health Services is to reduce barriers for students, in order for them to receive comprehensive mental health services.

These barriers may include:

Transportation Financial restrictions Mistrust/Stigma Waiting lists/Intake Process Stress Scheduling conflicts



Services that may be Provided:

Intake Interview Diagnostic Assessment Individual Psychotherapy Group Psychotherapy Family Psychotherapy Individual Skills Work Family Skills Work

Fees for Service:

Services will be covered by individual and family health insurance companies. If costs are a barrier, SLMH services may be covered by grant funding. Please contact the SLMH therapist to receive more information on these options.
