


Reimbursement Rates




Total Reimbursement Received




Average Daily Participation (ADP)




Reimbursable Lunch Meals










Reimbursable After School Snacks




Reimbursement Rates for Free Snacks







Milk Substitution Rule for 2010–2011

- School cafeterias will no longer be able to substitute juice or water for milk since lactose intolerance and milk allergies are not considered disabilities.
- Students with an individualized health plan (IHP) or a 504 plan will receive a substitution.
- School cafeterias will offer water and cups, free of charge, to students who don't wish to drink milk.
- Bottled water and other allowable beverages will continue to be available for purchase.

Dietary Guidelines for Americans

- Mandated review by Congress every five years
- On June 16, 2010, USDA and HHS released 2010 Dietary Guidelines Advisory Committee's Report
- Release of final guidelines are expected by end of 2010
- May eventually affect the way school menus are planned
