### **Math Enrichment**

- extended this year to include classes for current fifth grade students
- continue to offer math classes for current sixth and seventh grade students
  - additional support in math
  - ready to move to another level of math.
- Dates: June 3-28, M-F, 8-10 and 10-12
- Location: Brooks Middle School
- <u>Tuition</u>: \$150 (scholarships available)

## **Music Camp**

- Large group ensemble focus
  - Band, Orchestra, Jazz Band, and Chorus
  - Students who are currently in 4<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade
- <u>Dates:</u> August 5-16, 8:30-12:00 (3 different class offerings)
- Location: Beye Elementary
- <u>Tuition:</u> \$75 per session (scholarships available)

### **Prep for Success**

- Targeted to students who are struggling academically
- Provide them with support prior to the next school year
- Changes:
  - Extend the program from four weeks to five weeks
  - Shorten the length of the day to three hours
  - Add in a component to include cultural activities
  - Provide RIT band instruction
  - Offer only two locations to minimize supervision costs
- Dates: July 15-August 16
- <u>Location:</u> Longfellow Elementary (PK-3) and Julian Middle School (4-7)
- Tuition: None

# Initial Prep for Success Student Data

- In an effort to communicate with parents early, we reviewed data to determine students who might be recommended to attend the Prep for Success program.
- Initial list shared with teachers so they could communicate with parents during conferences held in January.
- Parents informed based on preliminary indication. Told final notifications would be sent after second trimester grades in March.


## Several criteria were examined in developing a list of students who are candidates for Prep for Success Summer 2013 based on data to date:

- MAP scores: reading, math. Students flagged if half or more of most recent three scores felt below the 15<sup>th</sup> percentile.
- Trimester 1 report card grades: Students flagged if report card grades in reading or math were a 1 or 2 (elementary grades), a D or U (middle grades).
- DIBELS Instructional Recommendation: Students flagged if most recent DIBELS assessment resulted in instructional recommendation of Intensive or Well Below Benchmark.

<sup>\*</sup>Except for kindergarten students, for whom only DIBELS scores are available, a student was required to have two of the above indicators to be added to the list of candidates. No distinction was made between students with/without IEPs at this stage.


The following two charts highlight the number of students and % of students by school who meet the criteria.

#### **Number of Candidates by School**




The chart below displays students by grade level who meet the criteria mentioned above, the only data point we have for Kindergarten students is DIBELS.

#### Candidates by Grade Level




#### This chart highlights students being referred by subject area.

#### Basis of Recommendation by Grade




## Two-thirds of the candidates are students who qualify for free or reduced lunch.

#### Summary by Lunch Status








#### Breakdown of students by ethnicity
