The Board of Trustees of Henderson ISD met Tuesday, April 8, 2025, beginning at 6:00 PM in the Henderson ISD Administration Boardroom, 300 Crosby Drive, Henderson, TX 75652, with the following members present:

- 1. Call to Order at 6:00 PM President Russell Brown called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm.
 - A. Invocation Steve Miller led the invocation.
 - B. Pledge to the US Flag and Texas Flag WES Students Winnie Wu, Elaina Garcia, Henry Flanagan, and Oakley Oswald led the pledges.
- 2. Recognition of guests (6:07 pm) President Brown welcomed guests in attendance.
- 3. Campus/Staff recognition (6:07 pm) HHS art students Cherry Mapes and Bridget Linthicum were recognized for their recent state-level accomplishments.
- 4. Open Forum (6:09 pm) No citizens addressed the board in Open Forum.
- 5. Communication from citizens to discuss pending agenda items before the Board (6:09 pm) No citizens addressed the board regarding a pending agenda item.
- 6. Consider approval of Consent Agenda items (6:09 pm) A motion was made by Shannon Coats, with a second by Loy Dorsey, to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. The motion carried unanimously, 7-0.
 - A. Approve Minutes of the March 18, 2025, Regular Meeting.

7. Information/Discussion Agenda Items

- A. Hear report on investment transactions for all funds covered by the Public Funds Investment Act as of February 28, 2025 (6:10 pm) Kristin Byrd presented the required quarterly report on investment transactions for all funds covered by the Public Funds Investment Act. As of February 28, 2025, the market value of our investments totaled \$35,503,544.34. Operating funds totaled \$26,013,849.34 of our investments, comprising 47% Commercial Paper, 0% Agencies, 0% Municipal Securities, 35% Treasuries, and 17% held in the district's Money Market at Texas Bank. The district has realized \$454,274.89 of interest as of February 28, 2025, for FY 2025.
- B. Financial Report February 2025 (6:12 pm) Kristin Byrd presented the reconciled financials as of February 28, 2025.
- C. Hear a discussion over Bluebonnet Learning Materials (6:12 pm) Dea Henry presented information on instructional materials available to districts. Funding for the allotment is \$40 per student for anything on the State Board of Education's (SBOE) approved list, with an additional \$20 per student available if Bluebonnet Learning

Materials, the state's Open Educational Resources (OER), is utilized. Districts have autonomy in selecting and implementing instructional materials and can modify or exclude specific content. Districts can also tailor educational content to align with community standards and educational goals. HISD has the authority to adopt, modify, or reject Bluebonnet Learning Materials. A comparison of Bluebonnet Learning Materials, Amplify Reading, and Eureka Math was presented. Texas teachers were invited to weigh in on the changes needed to make these materials the best fit for Texas students using TEKS.

8. Consider approval of Action Agenda items.

- A. Consider approval of changes to policy EIC (LOCAL) (6:30 pm) Dr. Terry Everitt presented revisions to Policy EIC (LOCAL) for approval. Henderson High School and Henderson Middle School requested revisions to EIC (LOCAL) to ensure our practices align with the appropriate policy language. These updates are necessary due to changes in the Credit by Exam process and adjustments to graduation requirements regarding foreign language credits. Revisions include:
 - Removing the "9-12" language for the graduating classes of 2025, 2026, 2027, 2028, and 2029 and replacing it with "at any grade." This aligns with our practice of awarding high school credit in Algebra 1 and Spanish in the 8th grade.
 - Specifying that current 7th-grade students (Class of 2030) will only include English, math, science, and social studies in their class rank calculation.
 - Clarifying that courses taken through Credit by Exam will not be included in class rank calculations.

The Site-Based Decision-Making Committee at HHS, consisting of teachers, support staff, parents, and business representatives, reviewed and approved these changes. A motion was made by Jean Williams, with a second by Dr. John Taylor, to approve the Policy revisions as outlined by Dr. Everitt. The motion carried unanimously, 7-0.

- B. Consider approval of updates to the Gifted and Talented Program Manual. (6:38 pm) Liana Kirk presented the updated comprehensive manual for Gifted and Talented services for approval. The state requires districts to update their Gifted and Talented (GT) manuals every three years, and these updates must be approved by the board. A motion to approve the updates to the Gifted and Talented program, as presented, was made by Loy Dorsey and seconded by Sonny Simmons. The motion carried unanimously, 7-0.
- C. Consider approval of the Bluebonnet Learning Materials Transition Plan (6:40 pm) Dea Henry presented the Bluebonnet Learning Transition Plan for approval. To qualify for the State-Developed Open Education Resource (OER) Entitlement for instructional materials procurement funding, the board must adopt an OER instructional material transition plan. The district utilized a template provided by Region 7 to develop the transition plan, which contained the following action steps to complete: Setting Implementation Goals, Creating the Conditions for Success, Leading Internalization and Professional Learning Communities, Establishing Observation and Feedback Practices, and Aligning Assessment Strategy. A motion to approve the transition plan

- was made by Shannon Coats, with a second by Sonny Simmons. The motion carried unanimously, 7-0.
- D. Consider approval of Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) Certification. (6:43 pm) - Regina Sugg presented the annual TEKS Certification for approval. Per TEC §31.1011, local education agencies (LEA) are required to certify annually to the State Board of Education and the commissioner that students have access to instructional materials covering all Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) for all required subjects, except physical education. Additionally, LEAs are required to certify that they protect against access to obscene or harmful content in compliance with the requirements for certification under (i) the Children's Internet Protection Act (Pub. L.No.106-554); (ii) Section 28.0022; (iii) Section 43.22, Penal Code; and (iv) any other law or regulation that protects students from obscene or harmful content. The board viewed the TEKS Certification 2025-26 Survey, which includes a section for LEAs to verify compliance with this requirement. A question was raised as to why there was a response of "no" to number 26, stating, "Are instructional materials for science managed at the LEA level and generally consistent across classrooms?". In response, the district has not adopted a science curriculum as the State Board of Education currently does not have an approved list for science. A motion was made by Jean Williams, with a second by Dr. John Taylor, to approve the presented certification as potentially amended. The motion carried unanimously, 7-0.
- E. Consider approving the purchase of Bluebonnet Learning Materials (6:47 pm) Dea Henry presented the purchase of Bluebonnet Learning Materials for approval. HISD teachers and administrators have determined that these materials will best meet the needs of students in grades K-5 reading, K-8 math, and Algebra 1. These materials will be purchased for the 2025-2026 school year, utilizing the SBOE-approved instructional materials entitlement and the state-developed OER entitlement for additional instructional materials printing costs. For the two years from FY 2024 to FY 2025, the district received an entitlement of \$250,200 in the EMAT system; for FY 2025, the district will receive \$59,260 from the SBOE Open Educational Resource additional printing entitlement, for a total entitlement of \$309,460. This entitlement from the state can only be used for items on the SBOE-approved list, and if we do not access the \$20 additional Bluebonnet printing money, the funds remain unused in the online system. The year-one total for K-5 math, K-8 math, and Algebra 1 is \$186,154. The year-two total for the same grades totals \$83,110, which is significantly less since items such as math manipulatives, readers, and decodables used for phonics will not need to be purchased again. The district requests that the board approve an amount not to exceed \$200,000 for the year-one purchase. A motion was made by Justin Scarborough, with a second by Loy Dorsey, to approve the purchase as presented. The motion carried unanimously, 7-0.
- 9. Superintendent Report (6:54 pm) Superintendent Bowman reported that enrollment was at 3,264, down nine students from this time last year. ADA is at 94.23%. Strategies were discussed to address truancy.
