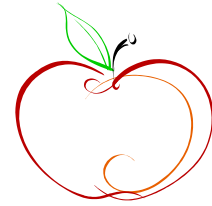

Title One

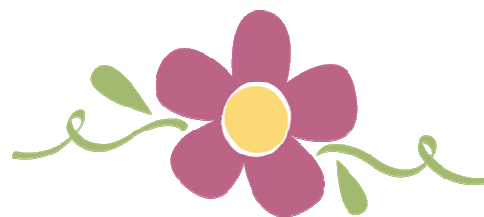
We have enclosed a form that needs to accompany medicine(s) for your student. Please read mandatory medication policies for all students attending school.

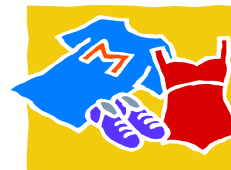
