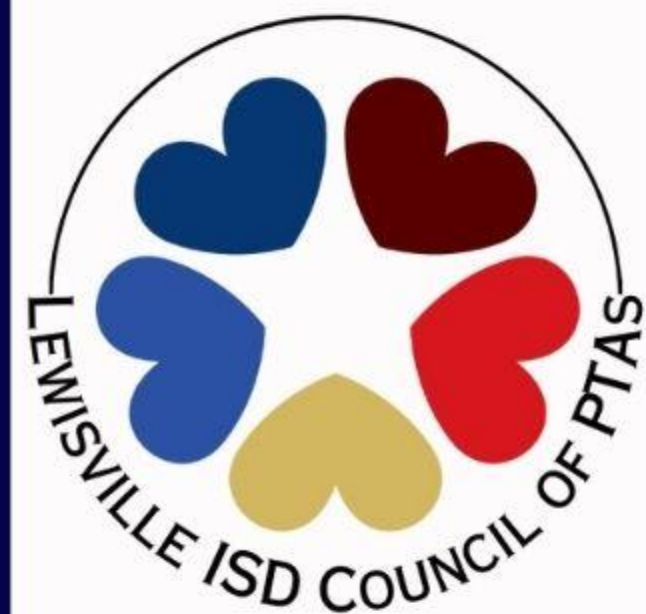

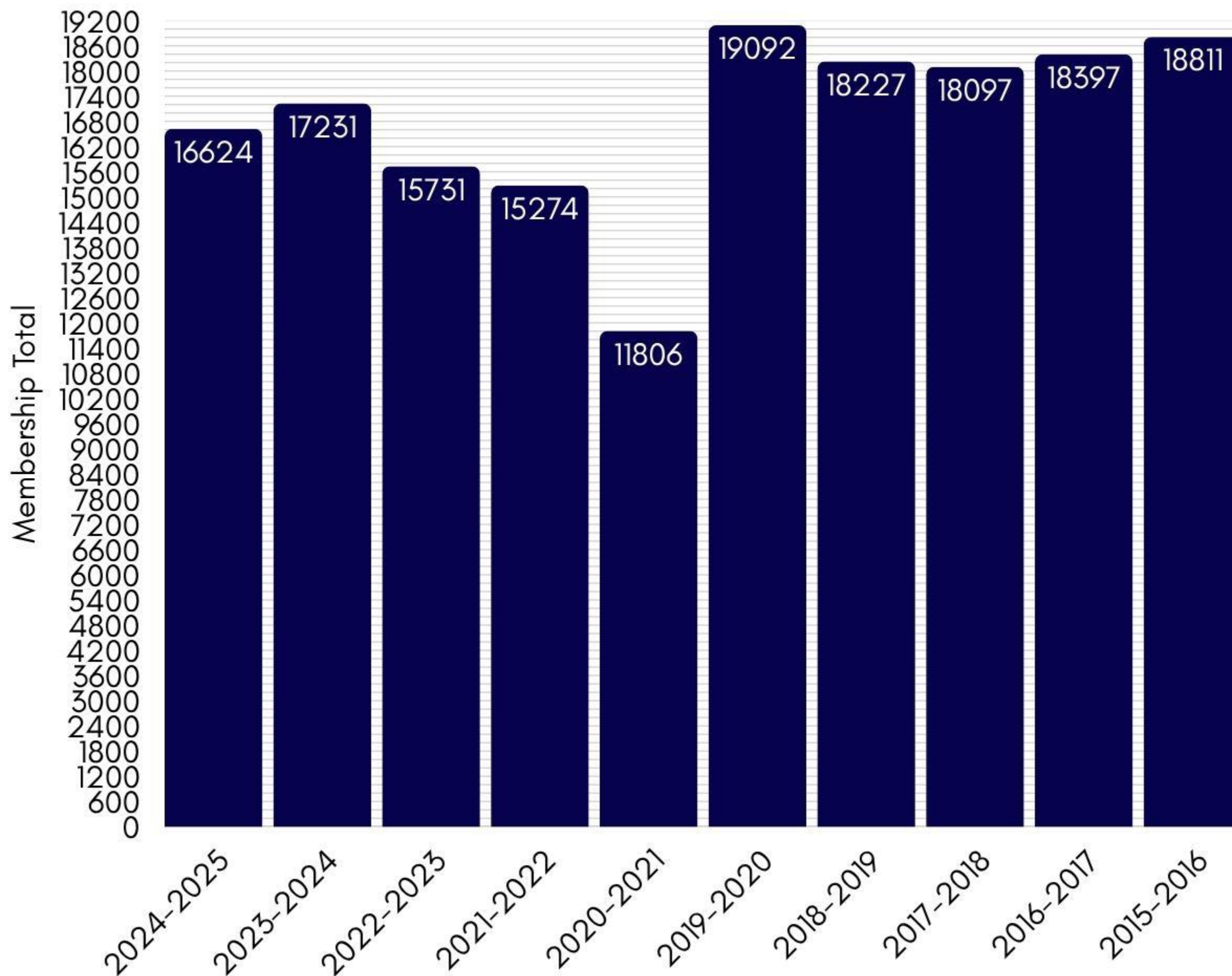

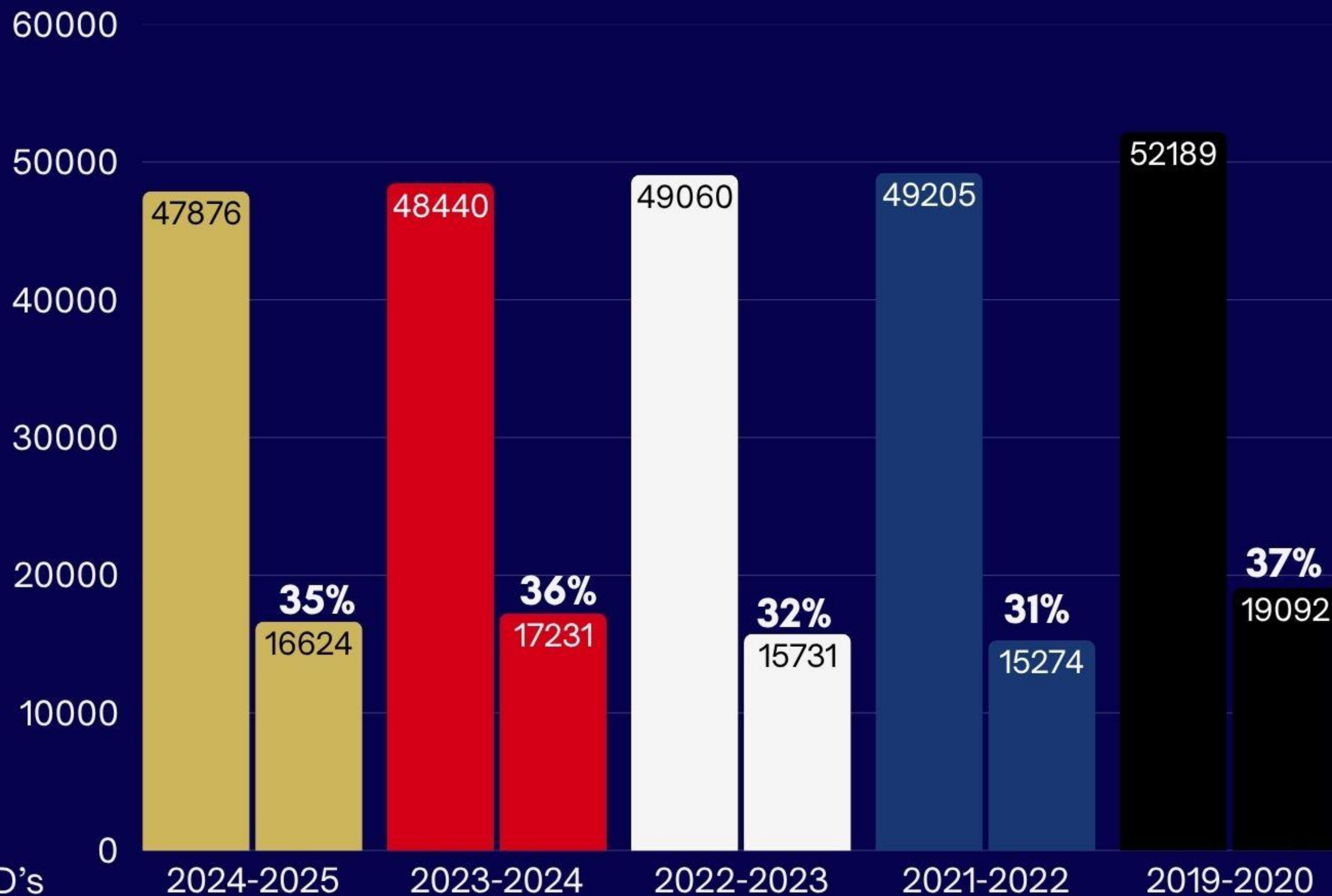


Membership Totals for the Last 10 Years

Texas PTA

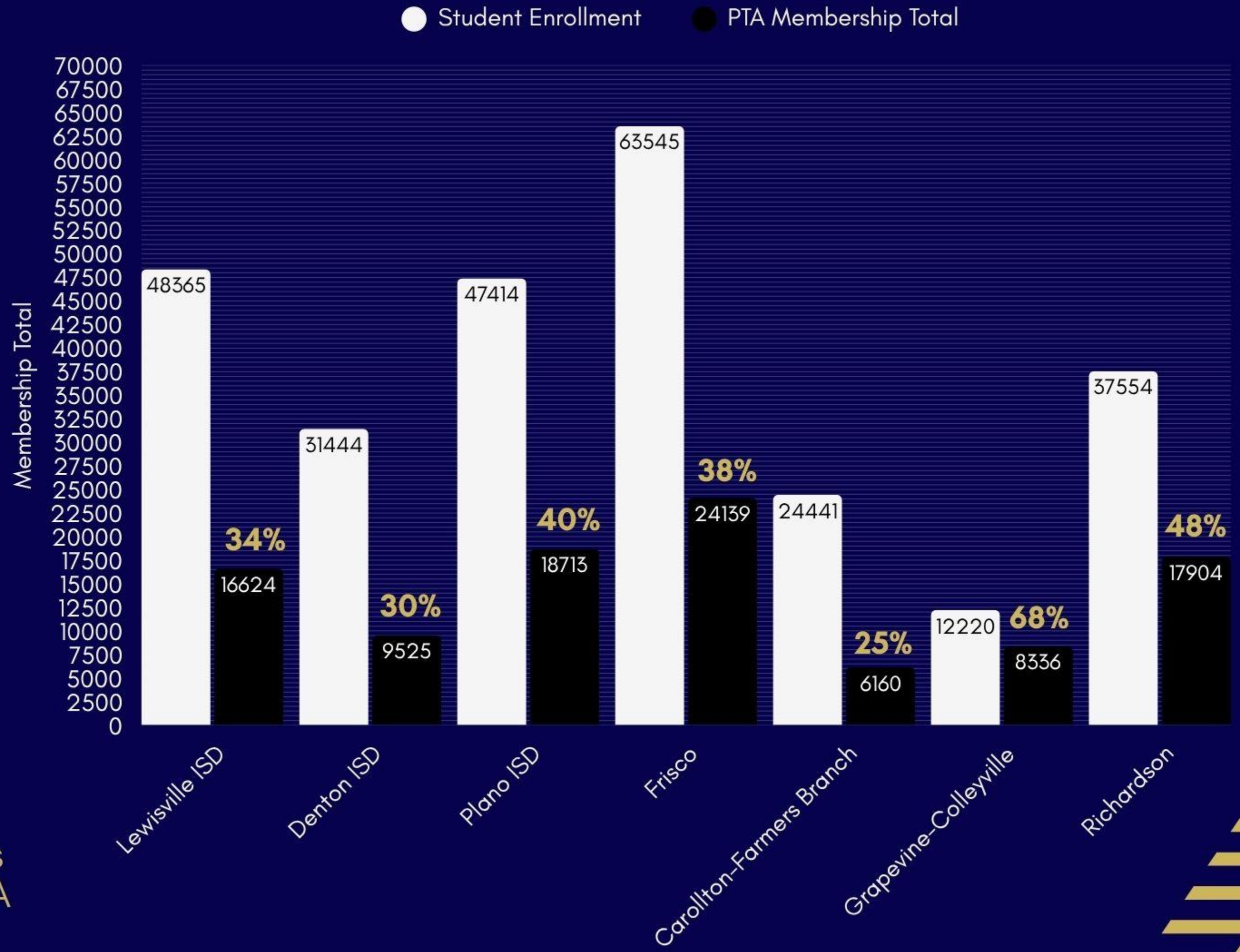
PTA Engagement by year

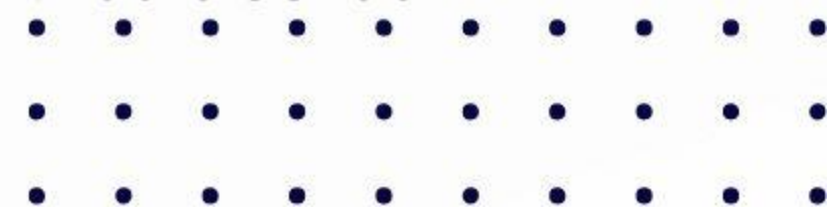

2024 FALL ELECTION

YOUR VOTE HAS A BIG IMPACT IN THE TEXAS ELECTIONS

1. When does the legislature meet? The Texas Legislature meets for 140 days every two years in odd-numbered years. The session begins at noon on the 2nd Tuesday in January (the 89th Session starts January 14, 2025).
2. How many legislators are in each chamber? The Texas House of Representatives has 150 members, and the Texas Senate has 31 members.
3. How long do legislators serve? Members of the Texas House of Representatives serve two-year terms, and members of the Texas Senate serve four-year terms. There are no limits on the number of consecutive terms a legislator can serve.
